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#### ART STUDENTS ADD FLAIR TO LOCAL RESTAURANT

After months of preparation, the St. Petersburg High School National Art Honor Society students have given St. Pete institution, Skyway Jack's, a much-anticipated facelift.

As part of a community-engagement project, art students designed murals for the fencing around the nearly 50-year-old restaurant on 34th Street South. They also repainted the restaurant's iconic sculptures out front. The new owner is a Pittsburgh Steelers fan, so the pig is now bright yellow, and Humpty Dumpty and the rooster are yellow and black.

"I just wanted to let the kids come out and have some fun," said Darren Forte, owner of Skyway Jack's. "The place was looking kind of dull, so I just thought maybe they could paint it up and have a chance to express themselves."

Xavier Licudine, a senior and the club's historian, said he has enjoyed the planning aspect of the project. Prior to their first visit, the club members, comprised of about 80 2D and 3D artists, sketched and planned the murals. He worked on-site a total of four times

"As a photographer, I've never really tried painting, so it's a new medium for me," Licudine said. "It's not my niche, but it's been really fun to explore and expand my capabilities with my classmates and clubmates."

According to Rachel Koral, the visual arts teacher at St. Pete High, each student in the honor society needs 25 art-related volunteer hours per year. For Skyway Jack's, the students created six murals, each with a different theme, but all-encompassing how the artists view

"We kind of spruced them up, so they have more street appeal because obviously, this is a much-loved restaurant to this area," said Elle Orchard, regarding the statues. "With the murals, we wanted to include different sports teams, local architecture and also the thoughts of the artists."

Forte and his staff plan to judge the murals and award the winning artist with a \$250 scholarship.

Skyway Jack's is located at 2795 34th St. S., St. Petersburg.

**CREDIT RECOVERY:** Credit recovery via edmentum is available after school on Mondays, Wednesdays, and Thursdays from 2-3pm for ALL STUDENTS. Athletes should check with their counselor regarding credit recovery that aligns with NCAA eligibility requirements.

**COLLEGE VISITS:** Juniors and seniors looking for their "perfect fit" for higher education are encouraged to take college visits. They should go to the Front Office to pick up and fill out a TDE form PRIOR to the trip. Proof of the visit must be provided to the Front Office upon return to receive an excused absence. A total of 4 "College Days" are allowed. For IB students, please pick up your TDE from Ms. Norton in the IB Office.

**PSAT FOLLOW UP:** All 9th, 10th, and 11th graders took the PSAT in October; the scores are available now online and can be accessed following these directions:

- Go to studentscores.collegeboard.org.
- · Click "Sign Up" under the Sign In spaces.
- Input your personal information under "Create Your Student Account."
  - Once students have set up their College Board account, they will need to log in to the account to access score
    information. Students should enter their username and password (at studentscores.collegeboard.org). They will
    be redirected to their SAT Suite of Assessments score-reporting portal, with their most recent test showing first.
  - If their most recent test is missing, they can use the "Missing Scores" link to update their personal information and provide their access code or student ID that will match their scores to their account.
- When students log in to their College Board account, they will be taken to a dashboard (entry) screen that
  includes their scores, links to SAT practice, AP and core course work, and information about Student Search
  Service and career profiles.
- The first thing they will see on the dashboard is their most recent scores. The total score for PSAT/NMSQT ranges from 320 to 1520. It is the sum of their Math section score added to their Evidence-Based Reading and Writing section score. When students click "View Details," they will be taken to their detailed score reports.

## DUAL ENROLLMENT AT ST. PETERSBURG COLLEGE

St. Petersburg College offers college classes to qualified high school students in Pinellas County at no cost to the student. These courses allow students to earn credits toward a high school diploma and a college degree at the same time. Dual enrollment course grades are recorded to the student's high school transcript and his/her permanent college transcript. Therefore, students must give their best performance in dual enrollment coursework because the resulting grades can greatly impact post-secondary education opportunities, scholarship opportunities, and financial aid eligibility.

Courses on the Dual Enrollment Approved Course List are available on SPC campuses and some local high school campuses. Dual enrollment courses that are offered by a credentialed instructor at a student's high school must be taken on the high school campus.

To take Dual Enrollment classes through SPC during the first semester, students must:

FUROLI MEN'

- 1. See their school counselor to see if they qualify
- 2. Get directions to obtain an SPC ID number (share with counselor)
- Take the PERT, SAT, or ACT prior to obtaining permission to take dual enrollment courses
- 4. Students eligible for on-campus Dual Enrollment courses will have an opportunity to register for on-campus dual enrollment courses (for the 2024/2025 school year) during the in-house registration in the month of February. Please see your School Counselor for more information regarding eligibility requirements for Dual Enrollment.
- Obtain a completed Dual Enrollment Permission Form (for off campus classes)
- 6. Register for the class(es) through the SPC Dual Enrollment Office (for off campus classes) no later than the last day of school
- To be eligible to take an academic dual enrollment course a student must have a minimum unweighted cumulative GPA of 3.0. To be eligible to take a career dual enrollment course, a student must have a minimum unweighted cumulative GPA of 2.0.

**EARLY COLLEGE/EARLY ADMISSION:** Students who are interested in being a full-time Early College or Early Admission student must complete the application and submit to the Early College Program office no later than **2:00pm on February 10, 2024.** 

Full-time Early College or Early Admissions students must follow steps 1-3 listed above to enroll. Interested students should visit the SPC website at www.spcollege.edu for more information.



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#### **DUAL ENROLLMENT AT** PINELLAS TECHNICAL COLLEGE

High school students attending Pinellas Technical College (PTC) can be dual enrolled in post-secondary courses – tuition free! These courses give students credits toward a high school diploma and a career technical certificate at the same time. Hours completed at PTC may also transfer as credit hours to local and state colleges.

Dual enrollment students will be present in the same class as adult students; therefore, a higher level of maturity, independence, and initiative is important for student success.

Students who are registered for dual enrollment courses will have three grades per semester recorded on their high school transcripts. Therefore, students will need to work hard and commit to academic excellence as they perform at their best with the required PTC coursework. Please keep in mind that the resulting grades can greatly impact post-secondary education opportunities and/or scholarship opportunities. To take Dual Enrollment classes at PTC during the fall and spring semester, students must:

- Be at least 16 years old and entering their junior or senior year in high school.
- Have a minimum cumulative unweighted GPA of 2.0, or 2.5 GPA for medicalrelated programs.
- Show responsibility through high school attendance and behavior.
- Obtain a Dual Enrollment Application from their high school counselor.
- Return a completed application to their high school counselor, with all necessary signatures; once the PTC counselor has received the application, the student will be contacted regarding a shadowing date.

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

#### EARLY CHECK OUT PROCEDURES

Parents requesting early check-out of their student can call the school at 727-893-1842, ext. 2306 for the student to get a Permit to Leave slip. This alleviates any wait time for you when you come to pick up your student. If you come in, please understand that we do need time to get your student for you. Please allow at least 30 minutes. This will give the school the opportunity to look up the student's schedule and send for them to meet you in the main office. Parents, it is important that we check the driver's license of anyone picking up your student early from school; this is done to ensure the safety of your child. After 1:30 pm there will be no permission to leave slips written, due to the time constraints of using the proper method of getting your child from class before school is dismissed.

#### **DROP-OFF AND PICK-UP PROCEDURES**

Thank you to all the parents who are using the car line to drop your students off in the morning and to pick them up in the afternoon. Student safety is our number one priority and using this designated area ensures that all students are out of harm's way.

#### **ABSENCES**

If you are absent from school, a doctor's note, phone call (727-893-1842 Ext. 2008), or written excuse from the parent must be emailed to StPetersburgHS. Absence@pcsb.org within 48 hours of the absence. The email should include the student's name, reason for absence, and parent's telephone number. A parent may excuse five days in a semester; further absences cannot be excused without a doctor's note. Absences should be for the following reasons: student illness, family emergency, death in family, medical appointments, and religious holidays.

Note: The Florida Legislature has enacted requirements that schools report to the Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles (DHSMV) the names of students who fail to satisfy the attendance requirements. This refers to students who accumulate 15 unexcused absences (excludes out-of-school suspension) within 90 calendar days. Students who fail to satisfy attendance requirements will be INELIGIBLE for driving privileges.

#### **COLLEGE VISITS FOR SENIORS**

You will need to bring back a letter on letterhead from the college you visited, stating the date you attended. The letter will need to be turned in to room 1-221 within two days of your return. Your absence will then be corrected. College visits do not count as an absence for exam exemptions.
