- Incomplete applications will delay processing.

MEDICATION INFORMATION

All students that plan to carry and self-administer an inhaler, epi-pen, pancreatic enzymes, or diabetic medication must have an Authorization to Carry Form per PCSB medication policy. Physician and parent signatures are required. The forms are available in Student Services, room 1-135, or contact the school nurse.

EXAM WAIVER DATES

SENIORS:

- April 26 Seniors can pick up exam waiver forms in IB or guidance office.
- April 28 Firm deadline is 2:00pm to turn in your exam waiver form to the IB or guidance office.
- May 3 There will be an exemption list emailed to teachers.

UNDERCLASS:

- May 10 Underclass can pick up exam waiver forms in IB or guidance office.
- May 12 Firm deadline is 2:00pm to turn in your exam waiver form to the IB or guidance office.
- May 17 There will be an exemption list emailed to teachers.

Seniors are eligible to exempt all exams that are not mandatory if they have an A or a B in each grading period for the course.

Underclass students (grades 9-11) may not waive any exam that they selected to waive first semester or that they do not have an A or a B in each Semester 2 grading period for the course.

Report Period 4 are provisional grades as of the date the teacher signs the waiver form.

Some exams are mandatory (cannot be exempted).

ART DEPARTMENT NEWS

On March 22nd, the nonprofit Alliance for Young Artists & Writers announced its 100th annual class of National Medalists in the Scholastic Art & Writing Awards—the nation's longest running and most prestigious program for creative teens in grades 7-12.

More than 100,000 students submitted more than 260,000 works of art and writing to the 2023 Scholastic Awards. 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EARLY CHECK OUT PROCEDURES

Parents requesting early check-out of their student can send an email to StPetersburgHS. Absence@pcsb.org or call extension 2306 for the student to get a Permit to Leave slip. This alleviates any wait time for you when you come to pick up your student. If you come in, please understand that we do need time to get your student for you. Please allow at least 30 minutes. This will give the school the opportunity to look up the student's schedule and send for them to meet you in the main office. Parents, it is important that we check the driver's license of anyone picking up your student early from school; this is done to ensure the safety of your child. After 1:30pm there will be no permission to leave slips written, due to the time constraints of using the proper method of getting your child from class before school is dismissed.

DROP-OFF AND PICK-UP PROCEDURES

Thank you to all the parents who are using the car line to drop your students off in the morning and to pick them up in the afternoon. Student safety is our number one priority and using this designated area ensures that all students are out of harm's way.

Please **DO NOT** enter the Student Parking Lot or the Faculty Parking Lot to drop off your child. Please do not stop on 5th Avenue and let your child out of the car.

The safe drop-off and pick-up locations are the car circle by Devil's Drive on 27th St. off 5th Ave. and 28th St. and 7th Ave.

Thank you so much for your cooperation! Working together we can keep St. Pete High safe! **COLLEGE VISITS FOR SENIORS**

Do you plan on visiting a college? If so, you must stop by Building 1 room 107, and pick up a College TDE form. You will need to have all your teachers and a parent/guardian sign the form; return it to Building 1 Room 107 three days prior to your visit. Make sure to read the directions on the TDE. You will need to bring back a letter on letterhead from the college you visited, stating the date you attended. The letter will need to be turned in to Building 1 Room 107 within two days of your return. Your absence will then be corrected. College visits do not count as an absence for exam exemptions.

ABSENCES

If your child is absent from school, the fastest way to get their absence entered is to email StPetersburgHS.Absence@pcsb.org within 48 hours of the absence. The email should include the student's name, reason for absence, the date of the absence/s and parent's telephone number. A parent may excuse five days in a semester; further absences cannot be excused without a doctor's note. Absences should be for the following reasons: student illness, family emergency, death in family, medical appointments, and religious holidays.

Note: The Florida Legislature has enacted requirements that schools report to the Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles (DHSMV) the names of students who fail to satisfy the attendance requirements. This refers to students who accumulate 15 unexcused absences (excludes out-of-school suspension) within 90 calendar days. Students who fail to satisfy attendance requirements will be INELIGIBLE for driving privileges. HAVE YOU MOVED?

Did you know that if the school sends you a letter it will NOT be forwarded to your new address? If you've recently moved, please do the following to change your address:

- Go to www.pcsb.org
- At the top of the page on the right side click on Login

- Click on Student Reservation
- Type in User Name* and Password* (This is the same User Name and Password that parents use to log in to Portal/Focus)
- Click on Change of Address and continue until you reach the end
- Email your two proofs of address to fowlerti@pcsb.org or meltonp@pcsb.org; acceptable proofs of address include a copy of a lease and a utility bill (electric, water, cable) or two utility bills

*If you do not know your Username and Password, please email a copy of your driver's license to fowlerti@pcsb.org or meltonp@pcsb.org and one will be created and/or reset and emailed to you. If you should have any issues/questions please give us a call at 727-893-1842, ext. 2315. UPDATED INFORMATION IN FOCUS

It's very important that we have the most current information for your student. This includes correct address, phone number, email address, and contact numbers. Please update your address, phone number, and/or email address by logging into the Student Reservation System with your parent username and password at www.pcsb.org. If you do not have a parent username and password please email fowlerti@pcsb.org or derricksonm@pcsb.org a copy of your driver's license and the name of your student to get one. If your address has changed, please email your two proofs of residency along with your student's name to fowlerti@pcsb. org or meltonp@pcsb.org.

DELIVERY OF FLOWERS, BALLOONS, ETC.

With safety in mind, the school cannot accept any type of flower or balloon arrangements for delivery to students. Many times, these gifts are in glass containers which can be broken. In addition, they cause class disruption. Please do not send any type of delivery to students here at school. They will be refused and sent back to the sender. Your understanding and cooperation are greatly appreciated.

NEED TO USE THE ELEVATOR?

If you ever need to use the elevator at school, you will need to bring in a doctor's note stating how long the elevator will be required. Before the elevator key is issued the student will have to make a \$20.00 deposit that will be returned by check in the mail once the key is returned. Elevator keys can be obtained in the bookkeeping office.

PARKING HANG TAG SALE 2023-2024 SCHOOL YEAR

Students must have a current SPHS Hang Tag to park in the student lot. Hang tags for the 2023-2024 school year will be sold in the IB Office (room 157) on the following dates:

- JUNIORS (Class of 2025): Can purchase a tag on Tuesday, May 23, 2023, from 2:30pm - 3:30pm.

To purchase a tag, you must have:

- A copy we can keep of your car registration.

Seniors must have their completed forms turned in to their school counselor by **May 12th** so that the information can be recorded. Seniors who qualify and have applied for Bright Futures will be notified of their award status late July or early August for the Fall semester.

CREDIT RECOVERY

TESTING, TESTING

The state of Florida has determined testing "windows" for End of Course Assessments. Students who are enrolled in: US History, Biology, Algebra 1, or Geometry will be taking an EOC. Students will be notified of the date, time, and location for each test that they are taking. It is vital that students show up on time and put forth their best effort on their exams. Parents can support their students by encouraging them and making sure that they are well rested and on time.

SPC DUAL ENROLLMENT

The deadline to sign up for Summer DE is April 28th and the deadline to sign up for Fall DE is May 25th. Students who are doing Dual Enrollment on SPHS' campus and/or at St. Petersburg College campus this summer/next year must have an unweighted 3.00 GPA, required test scores, and obtain an SPC ID. For classes at SPC, registration paperwork must be completed. Please contact your counselor for more information.

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SUMMER BRIDGE

Register for Summer Bridge to make sure you are ready to get caught up on credits and testing. SUMMER BRIDGE EXPECTATIONS:

- Students with excessive absences will be removed from the program
- Students are expected to be on time to their classroom (all classes are face to face on campus)
- Transportation will be provided if students have that need through arterial bus stops.
- It is an opportunity and privilege to attend the Summer Bridge Credit Recovery Program. Students must follow all school rules and policies, as defined by the PCS Code of Student Conduct.

Summer Bridge programs listed below will be offered here at St. Pete High School, Mondays through Thursdays from 8:30am to 12:30pm.

See below for the different options for Summer Bridge/Credit Recovery programs for Summer 2023.

- Algebra 1 Course Retake for Credit Recovery- June 5th through 23rd This course is for current 9th and 10th grade students who have failed all or either semester of Algebra 1 or Algebra 1A.
- Algebra 1 EOC retake Prep- June 26th through July 13th This program if all current 9th and 10th grade students who fail the Spring 2023 Algebra 1 EOC. Students will sit for the Algebra 1 EOC retakes on 7/12 and 7/13.
- ACT Read/ELA Prep June 26th through July 13th This program is for current 10th and 11th graders who need to prepare to pass the ACT Read/ELA test for graduation or any other current 10th/11th graders who would like help to improve their ACT Read/ELA score. Students will have the opportunity to take the ACT on Sat., July 15th at no cost to them. Deadline to register is JUNE 16th so that you can get registered for the ACT.
- ACT Math Prep June 26th through July 13th This program is for current 10th and 11th graders who need to prepare to pass the ACT Math test for graduation or any other current 10th/11th graders who would like help to improve their ACT Math score. Students will have the opportunity to take the ACT on Sat., July 15th at no cost to them here at SPHS. Deadline to register is JUNE 16th so that you can get registered for the ACT.
- Credit Recovery (core academic subjects) May 30th through July 13th This program
 is for current 9-12 grade students who have failed a core academic course that is required for
 graduation. Students who need to recover credits use a program called APEX, which allows
 them to make up failed courses at their own pace, so they can get back on track to graduate.
