AIR FORCE JROTC NEWS

As we prepare for the return of the Green Devil Cadets, we are excited to kick off our third year of Air Force Junior ROTC at SPSHS. With our mission of "Developing Citizens of Character", there is no better time to grow the next generation of American Leaders. Our goal is to challenge Cadets to grow mentally and physically by stepping outside of normal comfort zones. We encourage 9th-12th grade students interested in sharpening life skills to consider enrolling in this inspiring course. Whether your child is college bound, headed into the workforce, or planning on joining the military, this program is designed to prepare students to be college or career ready. There is **NO OBLIGATION** to join the military, however, if your child is interested in serving the nation, the SPSHS AFJROTC program will offer students a head start on becoming Leaders of tomorrow...not to mention a two-rank promotion as soon as they finish basic training.

The program routinely participates in Orientation Flights at Albert Whitted Airport, team building exercises, tours at MacDill Air Force Base, community service projects, US Special Forces demonstrations, Guest speakers from various military and civilian careers, launching of model rockets, attending a joint service JROTC Military Ball, and numerous academic and physical activities.

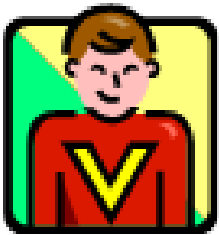

ALL volunteers must be in the PCSB volunteer database and have been background checked and approved. It takes 10 minutes to fill out the PCSB electronic volunteer registration form. Please talk to your family, work associates, and friends to help give back to our community by becoming a volunteer.

If you find your volunteer profile is inactive, you must reactivate your profile in the volunteer database PRIOR to volunteering/mentoring. We offer in person mentoring and virtual mentoring as well.

Please answer the criminal offense questions and be sure to click I AGREE with the confidentiality statement to SAVE your answers. You can update your personal information and log out in the lower right-hand corner of the screen. Do NOT re-activate using any mobile device. To do so may inadvertently answer the criminal offense questions incorrectly, which would delay your clearance.

VIRTUAL ID BADGE TO CHECK OUT TEXTBOOKS

Students, please go to the App store on your cell phones and download the Pinellas County School App. It is a free app and looks like this:



Open the app and log in with your R2D2 number. Once in the app you can pull up your student ID; this is called the Virtual ID Badge. If you had a photo taken, you will see a photo and barcode; if not, you will just see a barcode.

Screen shot your Virtual ID Badge and save it to your photos on your cell phone. You will need an ID Badge to check out textbooks, laptops and if you come in late for tardies.

ABSENCES

If you are absent from school, a doctor's note, phone call, or written excuse from the parent must be emailed to StPetersburgHS.Absence@pcsb.org within 48 hours of the absence. The email should include the student's name, reason for absence, and parent's telephone number. A parent may excuse five days in a semester; further absences cannot be excused without a doctor's note. Absences should be for the following reasons: student illness, family emergency, death in family, medical appointments, and religious holidays.

Note: The Florida Legislature has enacted requirements that schools report to the Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles (DHSMV) the names of students who fail to satisfy the attendance requirements. This refers to students who accumulate 15 unexcused absences (excludes out-of-school suspension) within 90 calendar days. Students who fail to satisfy attendance requirements will be INELIGIBLE for driving privileges.

COUNSELORS' CORNER

SENIORS: During early fall, counselors will conduct Senior Seminars where students will receive a copy of their transcript, financial aid information, things seniors need to know, go over graduation requirements and post-grad options. Seniors need to check their senior TEAMS page often, for scholarship and graduation information.

It's imperative for college bound seniors to take either the ACT or SAT for college entrance, scholarships, or to determine college readiness. The CLT is also an option, but currently only generally accepted by Florida public institutions. Test dates and test sites fill up quickly so it's important for students to complete their registrations ASAP.

Seniors should use the summer to determine when application deadlines are for their prospective colleges and universities. Then they can establish a schedule for themselves to be prepared to meet these deadlines.

Seniors who wish to take college visits will need to pick up the appropriate paperwork in the Main Office at least 3 days prior to the visit. Signed documentation of the visit will need to be presented to personnel in the Main Office upon completion of the visit.

XELLO is the platform seniors will be using this year for college related tasks. Take time to familiarize yourself with the platform. <https://www.pcsb.org/Page/42216>

JUNIORS: Juniors will have the opportunity to take the PSAT/NMSQT in October at SPS. Specific date of the PSAT/NMSQT will be announced in August. Students taking the PSAT/NMSQT will have the opportunity to become more aware of SAT directions and questions. The Student Search Service provides students the opportunity to receive information from colleges and universities. Students will be able to enter the scholarship competition from the National Merit Corporation. Juniors are also encouraged to start the college search process. College visits may start during second semester of their junior year. See above information.

Juniors who have not passed the FSA/ELA may use concordant scores from the ACT or SAT or CLT in its place.

It is NEVER too early to start your scholarship search to find money for college. Juniors are encouraged to register on College Board's BigFuture <https://bigfuture.collegeboard.org/> to complete the monthly task and be entered to win scholarship dollars.

SOPHOMORES AND FRESHMEN: Please note that all sophomores and freshmen will be taking the PSAT in October to help determine college readiness. There will be no charge for their participation.

Do not email your counselor for a schedule change. Email requests will not be accepted.



DELIVERY OF FLOWERS, BALLOONS, ETC.

With safety in mind, the school cannot accept any type of flower or balloon arrangements for delivery to students. Many times, these gifts are in glass containers which can be broken. In addition, they cause class disruption. Please do not send any type of delivery to students here at school. They will be refused and sent back to the sender. Your understanding and cooperation are greatly appreciated.

COLLEGE VISITS FOR SENIORS

Do you plan on visiting a college? If so, you must stop by room 1-107 and pick up a College TDE form. You will need to have all your teachers, and a parent/guardian sign the form; return it to room 1-107 three days prior to your visit. Make sure to read the directions on the TDE. You will need to bring back a letter on letterhead from the college you visited, stating the date you attended. The letter will need to be turned in to room 1-107 within two days of your return. Your absence will then be corrected. College visits do not count as an absence for exam exemptions.

DROP-OFF AND PICK-UP PROCEDURES

Thank you to all the parents who are using the car line to drop your students off in the morning and to pick them up in the afternoon. Student safety is our number one priority and using this designated area ensures that all students are out of harm's way.

Please **DO NOT** enter the Student Parking Lot or the Faculty Parking Lot to drop off your child. Please **do not stop** on 5th Avenue and let your child out of the car.

The safe drop-off and pick-up locations are the car circle by Devil's Drive on 27th St. off 5th Ave. and 28th St. and 7th Ave. Thank you so much for your cooperation! Working together we can keep St. Pete High safe!

EARLY CHECK OUT PROCEDURES

Parents requesting early check-out of their student can call the school at 727-893-1842, ext. 2306 for the student to get a Permit to Leave slip or email StPetersburgHS.Absence@pcsb.org (In the subject line put Permit to Leave, in email add student's name, date and time that need to leave along with the reason of absence) . This alleviates any wait time for you when you come to pick up your student. If you come in, please understand that we do need time to get your student for you. Please allow at least 30 minutes. This will give the school the opportunity to look up the student's schedule and send for them to meet you in the main office. Parents, it is important that we check the driver's license of anyone picking up your student early from school; this is done to ensure the safety of your child. After 1:30pm there will be no permission to leave slips written, due to the time constraints of using the proper method of getting your child from class before school is dismissed.

HAVE YOU MOVED?

Did you know that if the school sends you a letter it will NOT be forwarded to your new address? If you've recently moved, please do the following to change your address:

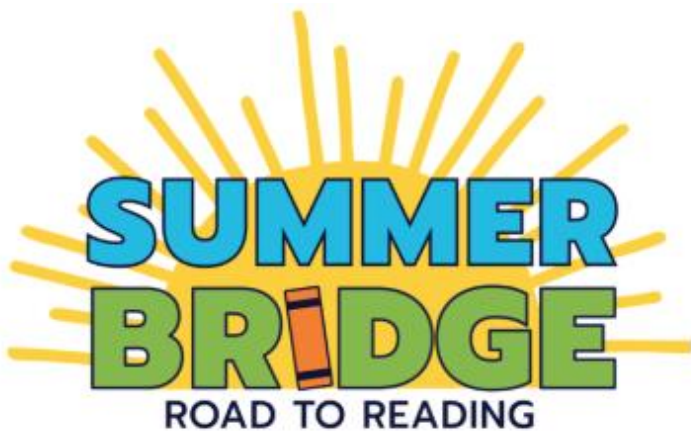

UPDATING INFORMATION IN FOCUS/ONLINE FORMS

It's very important that we have the most current information for your student. This includes correct address, phone number, email and contact numbers. Please update your address, phone number, and/or email address by logging into the Student Reservation System with your Parent Username/password off of the www.pcsb.org website. If your address has changed please email your 2 proofs of residency along with your student's name to johnsondenn@pcsb.org or fowlerti@pcsb.org. Also, when you login to FOCUS you will be prompted to complete the first day of school forms(Parent Acknowledgement of Student Code of Conduct, Media Release, Directory Information Optional Opt-Out, Network/Internet Acceptable Use Agreement, Technology Equipment Acceptance and Responsibility, Residency Questionnaire, School-Based Healthcare Services and the Student Clinic Card) online. Once you have completed the forms you will then have access to student's grades, attendance, and messaging.

NEED TO USE THE ELEVATOR?

If you ever need to use the elevator at school, you will need to bring in a doctor's note stating how long the elevator will be required. Before the elevator key is issued the student will have to make a \$20.00 deposit that will be returned by check in the mail once the key is returned. Elevator keys can be obtained in the bookkeeping office.



SUMMER BRIDGE INFORMATION
