Mission Statement

The mission of Clearwater High School is to build relationships that will allow us to provide a rigorous educational process which gives students the relevant information and skills needed to develop a foundation for life that enables and challenges them to be successful in a global and multicultural society.

- 1. Academic Cheating/Plagiarism:** 1st offense – Referral to office, zero on assignment, parental contact, IC All Day
2nd offense – IC (2) Days All Day, parental conference, zero on assignment, guidance alert. Alternative Bell Schedule (ABS) for next offense.
- 2. Automobile Responsibilities:** 1st offense – Warning/Parent contact
2nd offense – Parking privileges revoked for 30 days
3rd offense – – Parking privileges revoked remainder of school year
- 3. Battery:** 3-10-day out of school suspension, possible arrest, possible expulsion, parent conference, referral to guidance, and possible referral to School-Based Intervention Team
- 4. Bullying/Harrassment:** Referral to School Based Intervention Team, possible IC, ABS, suspension, reassignment, poss arrest, SRO consult.
- 5. Campus Disruption:** 1st offense – AP detention/IC, guidance alert, parent contact
2nd offense – ABS/Possible Suspension
******Severe campus disruptions will result in suspension******
- 6. Defiance/Disrespect/Insubordination:** Students who blatantly refuse to follow reasonable requests of staff members, refusal to follow general school expectations may include but not limited to the following consequences:
(Example: leaving class without permission)
1. Verbal reprimand, letter of apology
2. IC for period, parent contact
3. IC for day, parent contact
4. ABS, Parent contact, Guidance Alert
5. Out-of-school suspension (required re-entry conference)
6. Referral to guidance and School Based Intervention Team
- 7. Dress Code:** 1st offense – Student reports to IC, parent contacted for an appropriate change of clothing.
2nd offense – Student assigned 1 day of ABS.
****** 3rd and subsequent offenses will result in multiple days of ABS**
****** Hats/Headgear are not permitted. Items(s) will be confiscated and parent must pick up.**
****** The administration shall be the final judge about whether a student's clothing is appropriate for school or whether it will create an environmental climate that is distracting to learning. Principals, faculty, and staff members will enforce the dress code.**
- 8. Electronic Device (per semester):** 1st offense – Referral, item confiscated by A/P ret. at end of the day
2nd offense – Referral written, Item confiscated by Asst. Prin, parent must pick-up. Repeated concerns (ABS)
****** Students are eligible to bring their own technology to school for access to research, textbooks, and email communication. Teachers will define the parameters for technology usage in their classrooms. Students who do not follow the parameters will have their technology privilege revoked. Students are permitted to use their technology in the hallways for their own personal use. Students who inappropriately (noise/music/disruptive sounds/filming/pictures) use technology in common areas on campus WILL be subject to discipline per the master discipline plan.**
- 9. Failure to report to office with referral:** ABS/possible suspension, parent conference
- 10. Failure to provide I.D. or Give false I.D.:** ABS, Suspension, guidance alert, parent conference
- 11. Fighting:** 1st offense – 5-10 day out-of-school suspension w/parent conference, peer mediation, SRO consult, guidance alert, post situation summary/reflection, behavior management plan
2nd offense – 10 day out of school suspension
- 12. Gambling:** 1st offense – 3-5 days IC All Day, ABS, possible arrest
2nd offense – 3-5 days suspension, possible arrest
- 13. Harassment/Sexual:** 5-10 day out-of-school suspension, arrest, possible reassignment, expulsion, guidance alert, parent conference
- 14. Leaving Campus w/o Permission:** 1st offense – 2-days IC placement, All Day
2nd offense – 2-day ABS placement, parent conference
3rd offense – 2-day out of school suspension

- 15. Lack of Classroom Cooperation:** Students who blatantly refuse to follow reasonable requests of staff members, refusal to follow general school expectations may include but not limited to the following consequences:
(Examples: excessive talking, sleeping, out of seat, head on desk)
1. Teacher warning
2. Teacher detention, parent contact
3. Office referral, IC for period, parent contact
4. Office referral, IC for full day, teacher conference with parent
5. Administrative detention, parent conference
6. Guidance alert
- 15. Lack of Classroom Cooperation (cont.):**
- 16. Missed AP Detention:** 1st 2-days AP detention
2nd All Day(s) IC placement
- 17. Missed Teacher Detention:** Referral to AP.
* Note: Teachers must have flexibility in their schedules for more than one day of detention. Under this plan, students must be given options other than afternoon detention. Teachers will give students at least 24 hours to schedule detention.
- 18. Profanity (Classroom, Hallways):** Warning/letter of apology/IC/ABS/Suspension/relevant to the situation.
- 19. Profanity to Staff:** 3 days ABS, Out of School Suspension
- 20. Repeated Misconduct:** Continued defiance of school expectations and reasonable requests, previous referrals and disciplinary action with no improvement. Punishment will be comparable to the infraction for repeated misconduct, guidance alert, and referral to School Based Intervention Team, ABS, I.C. – Out of School Suspension. Alternative placement is also possible for repeated misconduct.
- 21. Skipping:** 1st offense – referral, AP detention
2nd offense/subsequent – IC/Multiple days IC placement, ABS (repeated)
- 22. Tardies (Every Semester):** Any student tardy to class should report to their class immediately.
Tardies are tabulated by semester.
1st-2nd - Teacher warning, parent contact
3rd - Teacher detention, parent contact,
4th - Office referral, parent contact, IC All Day
5th - IC placement 2 days
6th - ABS/Conference w/parent
7th - Multiple days of ABS
******* 10 minutes late = skipping *******
- 23. Threat/Intimidation:** Suspension, with a possible recommendation for reassignment
- 24. Theft:** 1st offense – ABS/Out-of-school suspension, arrest, parent conference, and guidance alert
2nd offense – Out-of-school suspension, arrest, parent conference, and possible alternative placement
- 25. Tobacco:** 1st offense – Fine, Smokers clinic or/3 days ABS, parent conference
2nd offense – Fine, parent conference, 3 days out of school suspension
- 26. Unauthorized Area** Detention, IC, ABS to possible suspension
- 27. Vandalism:** Restitution/work detail, parent conference, ABS, possible suspension, possible arrest

STUDENT ATTENDANCE
