Library FAQ *(frequently asked questions)*

General Hours:	6:30am – 2:30pm (occasional closures for meetings, EOC's, FSA, Inventory, etc...)
Student check-out:	student ID 4 books 14 days 10¢ a day overdue
Computers:	Sign in using your student login (r2.d2) *Public Computers* - don't download - don't change setting - save to your folder or One Drive https://login.microsoftonline.com/ORo365.pcsb.org
To print:	Find printer > location SHS > "library circ desk" Prints/Copies 10¢ per page (double sided printing/copying is available)
Food/Drink:	LOUNGE AREA ONLY NO food or drink in the library Capped, bottled water is ok

1. -Do I need a pass?
Yes, you need a pass during class time
2. -can I come in during lunch?
Yes, we are open during lunch.
3. -how long is the library open after school?
Open until 2:30pm (ok, sometimes 3pm)
4. -can I come in before school?
Yes, doors open at 6:30am
5. -how can I find my password to my student log in?
From your teacher or from the librarian; you use it for Portal too!
6. -where can I search for a book?

7. -who do I tell if I lose a book?
The librarian, silly; there will be a fee for the lost book
8. -When/where can I pay my fine?
In the library - any time! Fines should be paid before exams; you may not be able to graduate if you a fine too!
Fines can also be paid with a canned food – Food for Fines!!
9. -can I make a copy and how much is it?
The librarian can help you make copies and it is 10¢ per page.
10. -can I print something and how much does it cost?
Yes, use a print station: at the window, by the water fountain & corner of the circ desk.

11. -where can I get my student ID card?
Student ID's are made in the library; takes about a minute; acts as your library card, ID for dances, yearbook, sporting events, and for discounts at local vendors (MOVIES!!)
12. -I lost my student ID card where can I get a new one?
See above...but remember, your first one is free, **replacements are \$5** and, no, we don't make new ones every year!
