Invitations to Promise Time/ELP went out to students in grades 3-5 who scored a level 1 or 2 on FSA or who were retained. ELP morning tutoring invitations for grades 1-5 will be coming out to selected students within the first week of Oct. These groups will change in January in order to provide supports to as many as we can. We ask that you please consider the additional support for your child.

Y Reads has been in full swing for several weeks now. If your child receives an invitation, please consider. It is a great program and has a high success rate for struggling readers K-5.

We have completed our first round of MAP testing (Measures of Academic Progress). This assessment is a great indicator for areas of strengths and weaknesses in student learning. MAP results guide the teacher with tailoring their instruction to specific student needs. This assessment is also directly aligned to FSA. Below is a table of our overall grade level results. Our results for FALL 2021 show an increase from last year's % at this time last year. Please help us by assisting your child during homework sessions, allowing your child to participate in Promise Time/ELP tutoring, checking their grades in FOCUS, and communicating with your child's teacher.
