ATTIRE FOR MALE STUDENTS

BOYS: Khaki, Black, or Navy pants, walking shorts, or slacks. All bottoms <u>MUST</u> be secured at the waist, belts buckled, no underwear exposed.



BOYS: White, red, grey, or navy blue shirts with collars such as a polo, oxford, or dress shirt. Students will be allowed to wear school-sponsored T-shirts on Fridays or school spirit days


ATTIRE FOR FEMALE STUDENTS

GIRLS: Khaki, Black, or Navy pants, walking shorts, slacks, skirt, skorts, or jumpers. All bottoms **MUST** be secured at the waist, belts buckled, no underwear exposed











ACCESSORIES: Students may wear jewelry but with the exception of spiked objects, mace or sprays.



OUTERWEAR & FOOTWEAR

APPROPRIATE FOOTWEAR: All shoes must be closed heel or have a heel strap. Shoes may be any color.

No flip flops/slides





APPROPRIATE OUTERWEAR: Students may wear jackets, coats, rain coats, sweaters or sweater vests. Hoodies or outerwear with hoods are NOT







OUTERWEAR: No graphics, slogans, etc. No hoods or bandana head coverings. No pajamas or blankets.

SHOES: No slides, no flip flops, no mules or sandals without straps, and no bedroom shoes or slippers.

DRESS CODE ENFORCEMENT

There are daily dress code checks upon entry . Students found in violation of the dress code policy will receive consequences.

- ⇒ 1st Offense per semester Parent contact, change of clothing
- ⇒ 2nd Offense per semester-Change of clothing, work detail
- ⇒ 3rd Offense per semester Change of clothing, admin detention
- ⇒ 4th Offense per semester– Change of clothing, IR, Contract
- ⇒ Five or more Offenses Progressive discipline.

NON-NEGOTIABLES:

No shear, ripped or torn garments, no offensive language or graphic images.
