



ABOUT US...

- The Pinellas County School District is the 7th largest district in the nation, with more than 101,000 students.
- Pinellas County is the 6th most populated county in the state of Florida.
- East Lake High School was built in 1986.
- Our 2021-2022 enrollment is approximately 2,400 students.
- We have approximately 130 staff members.



AWARDS AND RANKINGS...

- ✓ East Lake High School received the designation of School of Excellence by the Florida Department of Education.
- ✓ East Lake, once again, earned the prestigious Best High Schools by The US News and World Reports!
- ✓ The school received an A school rating last year and has been ranked as an A school 11 times in the last 14 years.
- ✓ Our students took over 1,800 AP tests, which was one of the largest amounts administered in Pinellas County.
- ✓ 23 of our graduates earned their Associates of Arts college degree from SPC along with their high school diploma.
- √ 44 students graduated with the Pinellas County Schools Advanced Scholars designation.
- √ 53 students graduated with their AP Capstone diploma.
- √ 143 students graduated Summa Cum Laude with a GPA greater than a 3.8.
- ✓ Our seniors earned 1096 industry certifications in areas such as Microsoft Bundle, Adobe InDesign, Adobe Illustrator, Adobe Flash, MTA Networking Security, Networking Fundamentals, Biotech certification, and Engineering Core Certification.

- ✓ Wrestling enjoyed great success with the entire team advancing into regionals and some individuals qualifying for the State Tournament.
- ✓ Boy's and Girl's basketball teams also had winning years. The girls advanced to regional quarter finals; the boys advanced to regional finals. The boys were district and PCAC champs.
- ✓ Our Girl's volleyball team advanced to the Regional semifinals round of the playoffs.
- ✓ Our Varsity Football Team had another winning season advancing to the regional quarterfinal round.
- ✓ The Girl's and Boy's track team had a great year and the girls won PCAC.
- ✓ Both the Boy's and Girl's golf team had a great year with players qualifying for states.
- ✓ Our Girl's and Boy's tennis teams had amazing years and the girls qualified for states.

EDUCATIONAL OPPORTUNITIES...

- Academies include Business, Performing Art, Biomedical Science, and Engineering. Some of these electives allow for the opportunity of certifications.
- Advanced Placement courses include English Language, English Literature, Biology, Physics 1C Mechanics, Chemistry, Environmental science, US History, World History, Psychology, European History, US Government and Politics, 2D Studio Art, 3D Studio Art, Capstone Seminar and Research, German, Spanish, Chinese, Microeconomics, Macroeconomics, Statistics, Calculus AB, Calculus BC, Human geography, Music Theory, Computer Science.
- World Languages include French, German, Chinese, and Spanish.
- Through the Dual Enrollment Program, students may earn high school and college credits by enrolling in courses at St. Petersburg College, Students can also work toward certain vocational certifications at our local technical school, Pinellas Technical Center.
- Through the Career Exploration Program, seniors may explore career choices by enrolling in our Executive Internship Program.

BUS RIDERS – The buses will drop the students off at the front of the school.




CAR RIDERS – Cars should enter at the north end of the campus at Gate 3 and proceed through the drop-off line.

BUILDING NUMBERS...

At the top of most double doors, you will see a small sign like the one above. The B stand for <u>B</u>uilding and the number that follows tells you the building number. For example, the sign above tells you that you are entering Building 3.


Our Media Center is open during school hours. You can study, use the computers, do research, or use the printer for 5 cents a copy.


