Take Stock in Children Scholars receive:

A Scholarship – a tuition-only Florida Prepaid College scholarship which can be used at any university, college or vocational/technical school that accepts financial aid. (value is up to 120 credit hours at state college rate)

A Mentor – a volunteer mentor who will meet with your child bi-weekly virtually or at school, to assist and encourage your child to achieve their highest potential

A College Success Coach – a Take Stock staff member who will help your child design a college success plan and guide them through middle and high school and transition into college



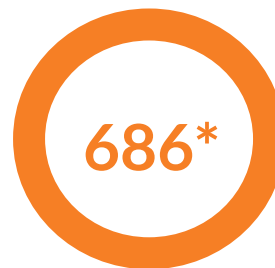

Students must be enrolled full-time in a Pinellas County School and be in the 6th through 9th grade at the time of the application.

ELIGIBILITY AND REQUIRED DOCUMENTS

Students may qualify by one or more of the four financial eligibility options below:

OPTION 1: Recipient of Free and Reduced Lunch **PLUS** meet USDA Income Eligibility Guidelines, income chart on front, and provide a Free and Reduced Letter plus first two pages of 2020 income tax return that shows student applicant name as a dependent, both Free/Reduced Lunch eligibility and income guideline must be met for this option (see example)

OR

OPTION 2: HUD Documentation, income chart on front, and provide current HUD Eligibility Letter - student name must appear on HUD letter]

OR

OPTION 3: Medicaid Recipient Documentation [provide CURRENT Medicaid eligibility verification document - student name **MUST** appear on document)

OR

OPTION 4: SNAP or TANF Recipient Documentation [provide CURRENT SNAP or TANF eligibility

Documentation and Sample of Tax Return

IMPORTANT:

Do not submit the following documents as they will not be accepted:

- Employer provided W-2 form
- Check stubs
- Bank statements
- Disability paperwork
- Statement of non-filing of taxes
- Screenshots for any required document
