- ID of and enrichment for academically talented 7th graders
- Assist students and parents/guardians to develop collegepreparatory academic plans for 8th grade into high school and beyond
- Provide practice to students before they take the PSAT and SAT in high school to qualify for National Merit or other scholarship opportunities and college entrance

Who is invited?:

- The TOP 15% of students within each school's 7th grade class as measured by their combined performance on the 2019 Florida Standards Assessments for ELA & Math
- Other 7th grade students from under-represented groups (minority or low income) who are academically talented.

These select students who agree, will participate in SAT tutoring in November and take the SAT on December 5th. If you have any question's feel free to speak to the Ms. Coughlin, the 7th grade counselor.
