

Occupational and Physical Therapy

<u>PROPRIOCEPTION:</u> The Proprioceptive System helps us coordinate the movement of our arms and legs in an efficient manner to play and move without even having to look. It allows a child to sit down without thinking about all the steps needed, to write with a pencil without pushing so hard that the tip breaks, or to take a drink from a juice pouch without squeezing too hard. Proprioceptive activities provide opportunities for heavy work (pushing, pulling, moving against resistance), which wake up your muscles and your brain.

Children who have inadequate proprioception present with awkward movements, avoids physical activity, chew on their shirts, prefer small spaces, give strong bear hugs, can't imitate movements, are unable to do familiar things without looking, and/or have difficulty with learning new movements.

Most children learn about their bodies and develop good body in space awareness (proprioception) by engaging in everyday play activities that allow for exploration and movement. Here are some of our favorite proprioceptive activities:

- Outdoor games: jump rope, hopscotch, leap frog, tug-o-war, wheelbarrow races
- Household chores: take out the trash, push a vacuum, move/lift heavy laundry baskets
- Playground: free play on monkey bars, climbing equipment (climbing walls, ladders, ropes), ziplines, and seesaws
- Community activities: swimming, karate, gymnastics, and kids yoga
