<p><b>ATTIRE FOR MALE STUDENTS</b></p>	<p><b>BOYS:</b> Khaki, Black, or Navy pants, or shorts. All bottoms <b><u>MUST</u></b> be secured at the waist, no belts, no underwear exposed. (<b><u>Zip ties will be provided</u></b>)</p> 	<p><b>BOYS:</b> White, black or navy blue polo shirts. Students will be allowed to wear Team T-shirts on Fridays</p> 	<p><b>THE FOLLOWING POLICIES APPLY TO ALL STUDENTS AT RICHARD L. SANDERS</b></p> 
<p><b>ATTIRE FOR FEMALE STUDENTS</b></p>	<p><b>GIRLS:</b> Khaki, Black, or Navy pants, Knee-length shorts. All bottoms <b><u>MUST</u></b> be secured at the waist, no belts, no underwear exposed. (<b><u>Zip ties will be provided</u></b>)</p> 	<p><b>GIRLS:</b> White, black or navy blue polo shirts. Students will be allowed to wear Team T-shirts on Fridays.</p> 	<p><b>ACCESSORIES:</b> Students may wear jewelry but with the exception of spiked objects, mace or sprays.</p> 
<p><b>OUTERWEAR &amp; FOOTWEAR</b></p>	<p><b>APPROPRIATE FOOTWEAR:</b> All shoes must be closed heel or have a heel strap. Shoes may be any color. <b>No flip flops/slides</b></p> 	<p><b>APPROPRIATE OUTERWEAR:</b> Students may wear jackets, coats, rain coats, sweaters or sweater vests. <b><u>Hoodies or outerwear with hoods are NOT allowed.</u></b></p> 	<p><b>OUTERWEAR:</b> No graphics, slogans, etc. No hoods or bandana head coverings. No pajamas or blankets.</p> <p><b>SHOES:</b> No slides, no crocs, no flip-flops, or sandals without straps, and no bedroom shoes or slippers.</p>
<p><b>NON-NEGOTIABLES:</b></p>			<p><b>NON-NEGOTIABLES:</b> No shear, ripped or torn garments, no offensive language or graphic images.</p> <p><b><u>No Hoodies or Jeans</u></b></p>
