Congratulations! It is time to prepare for your final year of high school. We encourage all students to continue to work hard, take advanced courses, raise your GPA, and acquire all the technical and soft skills you can to be ready and successful for both career and college.

These instructions will walk you through completing the reverse side of this course request form. If you have any questions, please ask a school counselor. They are always excited to help students create a plan to meet their academic goals.

Step A: Select your pathway to graduation.

Refer to the DHHS Curriculum Guide for detailed information on the graduation pathways, and all courses offered at Dixie Hollins. The curriculum guide can be found on the Dixie Hollins High School website.

Step B: Select your core academic classes.

- **English:** If you haven't tried an advance course yet, AICE General Paper is a good place to start. It can count as any English credit. If you have already taken AICE General Paper and/or other AICE English courses, then dual enrollment Comp I and II are great options to challenge yourself further, and earn college credit.
- **Math:** To all students aspiring to attend a four-year university should considering taking more advanced math classes. There are a variety of options, all students should seek teacher input when selecting a math course.
- **Science:** We strongly encourage all students to continue their studies in science for their senior year. There are several rigorous science courses to choose from. Any student selecting an advanced science course may want to consider requesting Experimental Science Honors as an elective to support the work being done in their advanced course.
- **Social Studies:** All seniors must take a US Government and Economics to graduate. These courses are offered as an online option. All students must take an online course as a graduation requirement. However, if you have followed the AICE curriculum throughout your four years, these requirements may be different for you. Please check with your counselor.
