


Most students take a college entrance exam at least two times in order to get the score they need for college applications or Bright Futures eligibility. Register for a May or June exam and practice to earn the score you need.



All students and parents are encouraged to review their course requests by going to the course request tab in FOCUS. Students will however be able to adjust their requests with their counselors through March 10th. 
