

Counselors Corner

DON'T LET MONEY PREVENT YOU FROM PURSUING COLLEGE!

59% of Florida high school seniors who complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) qualify for a Pell Grant, one of the largest forms of federal aid available to low-income students. But Florida ranks 34th in the nation for FAFSA completion. Last year, fewer than 50% of Florida's public school students had completed the FAFSA by June 30, 2020. According to FCAN estimates, high school graduates in Florida leave behind over \$100 million in Pell Grants each year because they do not complete the form. **DON'T LET THIS BE YOU!**

The sooner you complete the FAFSA the better. All graduating students should complete the 2021-2022 FAFSA. If a student is considering starting classes this summer they will also need to do the 2020-2021 FAFSA.

WHAT IS NEEDED FOR THE FAFSA

- FSA ID for both the student and the dependent student's parent/stepparent.
 ◊ CREATE at www.fsaid.ed.gov
- Your Social Security number.
- Your alien registration number (if you are not a U.S. citizen.
- Your 2017 federal income tax returns, W-2s, and other records of money earned.
- Bank statements and records of investments (if applicable.)
- Records of untaxed income (if applicable.)
- Parents' date of birth, Social Security number, marital status, and date parent was married, divorced, or widowed.

Once you have these items you are ready to submit your FAFSA at www.fafsa.ed.gov

We are hosting FAFSA FRIDAYS, where seniors/early graduates/parents can register to for a one on one FAFSA appointment with Mrs. Forbes. The link is on the left side of our BCHS Homepage.

Graduating students should also submit their applications for Florida Financial Aid (including Bright Futures) and the Pinellas Education Foundation Application. Students should complete this by December 1st.


