Campus Overview

Our campus has nine instructional buildings:

- Building 1 is in the middle of our campus (big hallway in the middle)
- Building 2 is the main auditorium (you are in it now)
- Building 3 is the music building (Northeast end of campus)
- Building 4 has three floors and is a building with multiple floors (North end of campus) – room assignments are by floor, so...
 - 4-106 means building 4, first floor, room 106
 - 4-212 means building 4, second floor, room 212
 - 4-327 means building 4, third floor, room 327
- Building 5 is the field house with a gymnasium, locker rooms, and multiple upstairs classrooms (East side of campus)
- Building 6 is for our medical science classes and office (Southwest end of campus)
- Building 7 is a small auditorium (Southwest end of campus)
- Building 8 is for JROTC (South end of campus)
- Building 9 is for technology, PLTW (Southeast end of campus)

 - Four Mathematics credits (must include Algebra and Geometry)
 - One HOPE credit
 - Three Science credits (must include Biology)
 - Three Social Science credits (1 World History, 1 US History, ½ American Government, and ½ Economics)
 - One Fine or Performing Art credit
 - One online class
- 2.0 Unweighted Grade Point Average (GPA)
- Pass required FSA reading/writing assessment
- Pass Algebra End of Course (EOC) Exams
