



- **Dual Enrollment Program:** students may earn high school and college credits by enrolling in courses at St. Ο Petersburg College and can work toward certain vocational certifications at our local technical school, Pinellas Technical College
- Career Exploration Program: Seniors may explore career choices by enrolling in our Executive Internship Program Ο







- o A long tone signals the beginning of a class period














NAVIGATING CAMPUS BUILDINGS AND ROOM NUMBERS

TARDY PROCEDURES

TARDY PASS Quick Reminders



Students enter Lunch Code and receive a printed ticket Automatically issues consequence & notifies parents

All tardies add up:

- 1-5 = Warning
- 6 = 30 min Detention
- 7 = 30 min Detention
- 8 = 60 min Detention
- 9 = ISS/Parent Phone Conference
- 10 = Administrative Referral/Referral to MTSS



CELL PHONE POLICY

Cell phones may be used in class as an academic tool, at the teacher's discretion. If students are using phones inappropriately or without teacher permission, the following consequences apply:

UNAUTHERIZED USE OF ELECTRONIC DEVICES/CELL PHONE

Electronic devices are allowed before school, during transitions, at lunch and after school but **not** during class (*referral at 4th offense*):

- Teacher redirects student student warning
- Teacher redirects student and contacts parent student warning
- Referral and detention teacher collects device (returned end of period)
- Referral and detention teacher collects device and brings to Student Services (student collects at end of school day)
- Referral and ISS teacher collects device and brings to Student Services (parent collects)

****Failure to comply is considered "Defiance."**


