

FAFSA:

This year FAFSA opens in December. The FAFSA must be filled out for your child to attend college, university or technical college. You must create both a student ID/PIN and a parent .ID/PIN. Create an account/pin number at www.FAFSA.gov.our FAFSA night will be wednesday January 24 where you and your parent can receive help on the FAFSA application.

SPC/St. Petersburg College:

Every year we hold an event to register for SPC and have the registration fee waived. Please encourage your child to apply. If they wait until Spring, they will have to pay the fee. If they decided on a different path, that's ok. SPC REGISTRATION OCTOBER 27 9AM to 11AM

Scholarships:

Many colleges offer their own scholarships so it's good to apply early. Pinellas County Schools posts a list of scholarships on their website at pcsb.org. Click on Students, then Financial Aid/Scholarships. You will see several links to various scholarship lists Pinellas Education Foundation has an annual scholarship application only for our county seniors that includes over 100 scholarships with one application. The Pinellas Education Foundation is offering Jump Start Scholarships for graduating students who demonstrate financial need and meet the eligibility requirements. Recipients receive a 1-Year Florida Prepaid College Plan valued at over \$3,100 to attend a Florida public college, university, or career and technical college. To apply, complete our general scholarship application at www.PinellasEducation.org/Scholarships.

Jump Start Scholarship Eligibility Requirements

Students must show financial need in order to be eligible. Eligibility is determined by submitting <u>one</u> of the
following documents: 1040 tax form for the 2022 or 2023 tax year, HUD, Medicaid, SNAP, TANF, or Foster
Care Documentation. The student's name must appear on the submitted documentation and it must be
dated no earlier than 2023. If you're qualifying based on your 1040 tax form, your household income must
be below the following thresholds set by the USDA:

Household Size	Maximum Annual Income
2	\$36,482
3	\$45,991
4	\$55,500
5	\$65,009
6	\$74,518
7	\$84,027
8	\$93,536

- Students must be a US citizen or legal permanent resident. Finalists will be required to submit a social security number before receiving the award.
- Students must attend a Pinellas County public school and be a Florida resident.
- 4. Jump Start Scholarships can only be used at a Florida public university, college, or technical school and finalists must complete the Free Application for Federal Student Assistance (FAFSA). Eligible finalists will be asked to provide school enrollment and FAFSA documentation after submitting their general application. The Pinellas Education Foundation provides over 100 different college and technical school scholarships to more than 300 high school seniors throughout Pinellas County, based on criteria established by the Foundation and sponsors. Varied as the sponsors who fund them, scholarships range in focus from the arts to science and math, sports, and community service. Many are based on financial need. Scholarships may be either one-time awards or renewable scholarships for students who continue to meet the scholarship qualifications throughout college.

Parent and Student Quick Start Guide

Sign into your Profferfish account through your Clever

- Find a volunteer organization. You can review approved organizations in Profferlish or find one on your own.
- Contact the organization and let them know you are interested in volunteering and see if they are currently taking volunteers.
- Once you have found an organization to volunteer at or if you have a paid work position, you will need to review our district policy and confirm that it meets the district requirements. You can review our district policy here: https://www.pcsb.org/Page/40036.
- Sign into your Profferfish account by going to your Clever account and clicking on the Profferfish icon.
- Review Pre-Approved Volunteer and Business organizations to see if your organization is already listed.
 - · If not listed, submit your organization for approval.
- If it is listed, look at the Pre-Approved Volunteer and Work opportunities to see if it is already listed.
 - If not listed, submit your opportunity for approval.
- Track your hours on our <u>Profferfish Hours Tracker</u> form.
- Once you have earned your required number of hours, enter your hours in Profferfish, share your reflection and submit for approval OR if your agency supervisor is present, they can sign off on your device.
- Parents will need to click on the thumbs up icon and sign. It will then be submitted to your counselor for final approval.
