


Principal's Message Continued...



We have our sights set on 89 points as our target to reach our school grade goal of a B!

- Our school-wide staff commitment is for every student at Hollins High school to make a learning gain, grow socially and emotionally, and become a leader ready to take on any and all challenges.
- We raised our graduation point 7 points in 2017 to 84%--the highest it has ever been. Our goal this year is to climb the ladder to 90% and live forevermore in that percentile.
- We have instituted extended learning time during the day – we call the 32 minutes provided daily 32 for U. This is a time where students can and do receive tutoring, homework assistance, visit classes they are struggling in, utilize SAT Practice. org, plan and set goals for the week, quarter and year.
- Wednesdays during 32 for U is designated as "Literacy Wednesday" where students work on various tasks, readings and engage in conversations around stories, topical events, fables and political cartoons to enhance their reading comprehension and proficiency.
 - *We have many seniors who have qualified to graduate in every other aspect, but do not have a passing FSA Reading/Writing score or commensurate concordant score on the ACT/SAT. It is a mission critical area of need for our students and school. For those who have passed, it is a critical area to work on to improve ACT/SAT scores to qualify for scholarships and earn extra points to gain entry into their college university of choice.
- As a Title 1 school, we have acquired an amazing array of talent to support our students in academics, social and emotional well-being, attendance and behavior. Our MTSS team of Scott Mason, Anne Caparaso and Don Ware work tirelessly to support students to achieve academic and social success. We also have a full-time Literacy (Adella Landstrom) and Math (Valerie Pinzon) Coach that support our students and teachers in those areas during their classes, in pull outs and during 32 for U.
 - *Our school's database "Rebels Rising" helps us track the progress and success of students, support them when needed and provides a lesson plan template for students and parents to access and acquire work and assignments.
