#### What is a Title I School?

# Title I schools receive federal dollars to fund the following:

- <u>Personnel</u> to help students succeed. At Skycrest, we have two reading interventionists, a full-time Social Worker, and a full-time multi-tiered systems support coach.
- <u>Academic workshops/family nights</u>
- <u>Materials for students</u> Title I provides students with <u>planners and compacts</u>.
- <u>Professional Development</u> for staff members including a stipend to be paid to all staff who participate in school-based trainings after school.
- Provides <u>intervention kits</u> to remediate and enhance reading skills for all students.
- <u>Promise Time program/ELP program</u>
- <u>Supports Leader In Me</u> leadership for students.

#### <u>Title I News</u>

Our 2023-2024 Parent and Family Engagement Plan (PFEP) has been approved and published. You may view this document in our school's Title I Resource Notebook located in the in the front office of our school, as well as Skycrest website.

# <u>Uniform Policy</u>

Shirts may be

- Polo style, crew neck T-shirts, or Skycrest t-shirts
- <u>Colors</u>: red, forest green, navy, light blue or white

\*Hoodies allowed but no graphics on shirts-only solid colors listed above. Students cannot wear hood while on campus.

#### Bottoms may be

- pants, shorts, skirts or skorts (must be midthigh length or longer)
- <u>Colors</u>: khaki, black or navy blue. Neat **dark** blue denim jeans (no holes) are allowed
- No denim shorts, skirts or skorts
- No leggings

\*Closed-toe footwear is HIGHLY recommended due to recess and PE.

\*Crocs are <u>not allowed</u> to be worn to school.
