- For current ninth- and 10th-grade students who need to prepare for the Algebra 1 EOC.*

### **Algebra 1 Course Recovery**

- Dates: June 6-June 23

*For all current ninth- and 10th grade students who need to earn credit for the Algebra 1 course.*

### **APEX Credit Recovery**

- Students will have the opportunity to credit recover classes.
- Dates: May 31st – July 14th
