Good afternoon, Eagle Families,

This is Dan Schmittdiel, Principal of East Lake High School, with some important reminders and updates as we wrap up the final eight days of the 2024-25 school year at The Lake – Tuesday begins Senior Final Exams and Friday begins Underclassman Final Exams, so let's finish strong! This week resumes state testing with Algebra 1 and Geometry EOC testing, with make-ups for missed EOC and AP testing. Check out this week and major upcoming events below:

Events	Dates
Geometry EOC and Algebra 1 EOC	On Monday and Tuesday, we'll facilitate the Geometry and Algebra 1 EOC's. All students enrolled in Geometry Honors will take the Geometry EOC on Monday 5/19 while all students enrolled in Geometry and Algebra 1 will take their EOC's on Tuesday 5/20.
ELHS Academic Awards Ceremony and Testing Successes	We'll celebrate students for various academic accomplishments at this year's Academic Awards Ceremony on Tuesday night at 6:30pm. Specific invitations were sent out.
	Additionally, we're celebrating ALL students who made a gain and/or showed proficiency on all of the FAST PM3 and EOC testing this year. Not only did many students reach proficiency, but many showed substantial growth – way to SOAR Eagles! Students who made gains and/or reached proficiency will be receiving a ticket in either their English or EOC course this week to earn a free treat throughout the week at lunch. They'll redeem this in the Eagle's Nest by Student Services. We're so proud of all of their hard work!
FAST and EOC Make-ups	We'll be facilitating FAST and EOC (Bio and US History) make-ups throughout the week. As we have continued testing Monday and Tuesday, we'll have small groups of make-ups each day. Those scheduled for make-ups on Monday and Tuesday received a call and email on Friday, and we'll continue to send passes for make-ups throughout the week.
Senior Exams	 Senior Exams begin Tuesday through Friday. Each day will have two exams scheduled with their classes, which they've been discussing with each teacher this past week. If a senior qualified for at least one exemption but didn't submit it completed yet, please have them drop it off at lunch on Monday. Also, remember there isn't a final exam for any Advanced Placement or EOC class (Biology, US History, Algebra 1, Geometry), and AICE courses only have a final if your student did not sit for the AICE exam. Tuesday 5/20 = 1st and 2nd period exams Wednesday 5/21 = 3rd and 4th period exams Thursday 5/22 = 5th and 6th period exams Friday 5/23 = 7th period exams
Underclassman Exam	Underclassman exam exemptions were distributed to those who qualified on Friday 5/16
Exemptions	during 4 th period classes – if your student was absent, they can retrieve it from their 4 th

	period teacher on Monday. These are due back completed by Wednesday during lunch or after school. We'll be collecting them near the Eagle's Nest, our PBIS store, and Student Services. Students can exempt up to three exams which they qualify for. A quick reminder, students must have four or less absences along with a C or higher in Q3 and Q4 to qualify for an exemption in a class. If they have any questions or didn't receive a form but believe they qualify, please reach out to the school.
Underclassman Final	We'll begin our Underclassman Exams on Friday 5/23 through Thursday 5/29, the last

Good luck to all of our Eagles in all of their extracurriculars and testing this week! Some additional reminders for the week include:

Geometry and Algebra 1 EOCs

Parents, as a reminder students enrolled in Geometry and Algebra 1 will take their EOC's this week. All Geometry Honors students will take the EOC on Monday 5/19. Geometry Regular and Algebra 1 students will sit for the EOC this Tuesday 5/20. For both assessments, students will sit from the start of the day until 10:50am but will be allowed to continue testing through the remainder of the school day if they need additional time. It's essential they take their time and not rush on the test.

Attached are some posters which cover strategies on tackling the test which students have been discussing and practicing throughout the year in class. Both of these assessments are adaptive this year. Every student will start at a level 3, which is a passing score. When they answer questions correctly, the questions will become more challenging, which means they're doing great! Students can't skip questions or flag them to return, so it's vital they give every question their best answer using the different strategies covered throughout the year and reviewed on the OnePager, and they can take as much of the school day for the EOC as they need beyond the 160 minutes. Please take some time this weekend to do a final review of these strategies with them before testing.

Summer Programs

Next week you may receive a call from Ms. Godwin regarding one of our summer programs, Edmentum Summer Credit Recovery and Summer Bridge. If your student has any core failures outside of Algebra 1, your student has already been registered for the program, which we <u>HIGHLY</u> recommend your student attend this program on day one, June 2. As students finish their courses, they wrap up for the summer, however it officially runs through July 17. It will run Monday through Thursday from 8:00am to 12:00pm in our Media Center. Please refer to the callout/email this week for more information and don't hesitate to reach out to the school with any questions!

We will also be running various other Summer Bridge programs, including Algebra 1 Credit Recovery/EOC Retake Preparation and ACT ELA and Math Preparation. These are intended for current 10th, 11th, or 12th grade students who still in need of a testing graduation requirement. If your child meets the requirement, you'll receive a call early this week with more information. For students requiring a graduation requirement for either the FAST ELA PM3 assessment or Algebra 1 EOC, we will also have a <u>free</u> in-school CLT available on June 18 (8:00am arrival time) where they can potentially earn a concordant score.

Class of 2025 Reminders

Graduation is fast approaching. It is crucial for seniors finish strong as they close out their final week before senior exams. Please ensure you are checking Focus to see where your seniors stand, and if there are any specific low grades at this point, please reach out to their teacher if you haven't been in communication recently to work on a plan for make-up work. - **TICKETS:** You do NOT need a ticket for graduation. Graduates are allowed to invite as many guests as they would like. There is a parking fee, but again, no ticket cost or limits on guests.
- **SEATING:** The event is open seating.
- PARKING:
 - Fee \$15.00 and CREDIT CARD ONLY, per CAR. ALL graduates, students, parents, and friends/community members attending must pay the \$15 fee at the parking lot entrances.
 - Gates: the open gates will be Gates A and B, with graduates entering through the Corral Entrance to the LEFT of Gate A.
- HANDICAP/HEARING ACCOMMODATIONS: Parking is available for all ADA guests in all parking lots on a first-come, first-served basis. Please make sure to display official placards. Also, there will be hearing accommodations section, should you require these services, please let our Graduation Coordinator, Mrs. Blum via email.
- **FOOD:** There will be a few concessions stands open with food and drink items for sale. Card purchases only.
- **BACKPACKS, BAGS, and STROLLERS:** No bags exceeding 12"x12"x12" are permitted and all are subject to search upon entry. Backpacks are not permitted, outside of diaper and medical bags. Strollers which are too large to fold under your seat have to be checked in at Guest Services at the Gate A entrance.
- NO BALLOONS ALLOWED. Visit raysbaseball.com/security for more details.
- GATE ENTRY:
 - Graduates are to arrive at 8:00am through the Corral Entrance to the LEFT of Gate A No exceptions. No early arrivals without a staff member with a school ID.
 Public gates (A and B) open at 8:00am as well.
- **GRADUATION DIPLOMA COVERS AND PROGRAMS:** When students exit the graduation, they will be escorted to receive their diploma covers as well as a brand-new event program for your keeping as they exit the arena.
- **GRADUATION DAY PICTURES:** All students attending graduation will have 3 pictures taken as they graduate (Plain background, American Flag, and with the principal during diploma hand off). You will receive information regarding purchasing after the event from Grad Images and Balfour.
- LIVE LINK/GRADUATION PROGRAM: Closer to the day of the event, we will communicate the LIVE YouTube link as well as the link to the online Graduation Program for those not attending.
