Closing Out Quarter 4

As a reminder, there is no school tomorrow in observance of Memorial Day. As we approach the last day of the 2024-25 school year, which is this <u>Thursday</u>, <u>May 29 for students</u>, it is imperative students wrap up any coursework which may still need to be submitted, along with giving it their all on their last set of finals. Grades will be finalized no later than Friday, May 30 by the end of the day, before teachers wrap up their final day before the summer. If your student hasn't done so yet, they'll need to clean out their locker and take their lock with them for the summer. They'll also need to return their textbooks to each of their teachers if this hasn't happened yet. Seniors who still need to return their laptops have received emails and calls from Mr. Anderson. Please complete this prior to graduation on Thursday.

ELHS Semester 2 Final Exams

We'll wrap up final exams Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday this week, which includes 3rd and 6th period exams on Tuesday, 2nd and 1st period on Wednesday, and 7th period plus make-ups on Thursday. Remember Thursday, the last day of the 2024-25 school year, is a full day this year. Students will dismiss at the usual 1:55pm end on Thursday. Summer Program Reminders

On June 2nd, we will begin our Summer Edmentum Credit Recovery Program, which runs Monday through Thursday from 8:00am to 12:00pm until July 17th in the ELHS Media Center. If your child has at least one core failure, you've been receiving reoccurring callouts from Ms. Godwin since last week. If you've been receiving this call, please ensure you sign your student up for the program so they can get back on track for the start of the 2025-26 school year. They're already registered, however filling out the survey confirms they'll be attending. Please refer to her callout/email for more information and don't hesitate to reach out to the school with any questions, and we'll see them on Monday, June 2nd at 8am!

We will also be running various other Summer Bridge programs, including Algebra 1 Credit Recovery/EOC Retake Preparation and ACT ELA and Math Preparation. These are intended for current 10th, 11th, or 12th grade students who are still in need of a testing graduation requirement (begins June 30th). If your child is still in need of a testing graduation

requirement, you've been receiving calls from Ms. Godwin on how to register for the program. Please know students requiring their FAST ELA concordant score for graduation have been enrolled in reading for the 2025-26 school year at this point to support their work to meet graduation requirements. If they earn a concordant score by the end of the summer, they can be moved out of the course for the start of the year. We will also have concordant score testing through an in-school CLT on June 18 at ELHS. Students will be registered if they are a rising junior or senior in need of either graduation testing requirement. They should arrive for the 8:30am start time, and we'll send reminders as the date approaches for those this applies to.

Finally, if your student failed Algebra 1, we will be running an Algebra 1 Credit Recovery Program through Summer Bridge which begins June 16th. Families with students still needing to make up this credit will receive a call this week on how to register.

If you have any questions about any of the programs, Edmentum Credit Recovery or the various Summer Bridge options, please don't hesitate to call the school. We do also have transportation available for families if needed.

Class of 2025 Reminders

Graduation is just four short days from today - we can't wait to celebrate the Class of 2025 on Thursday, May 29th, at the Yuengling Center at 9am! Remember, graduates need to arrive an hour early, entering through the Corral Entrance to the left of Gate A. We'll see them at 8am on Thursday! - <u>TICKETS</u>: You do NOT need a ticket for graduation. Graduates are allowed to invite as many guests as they would like. There is a parking fee, but again, no ticket cost or limits on guests.
- **SEATING:** The event is open seating.
- PARKING:
 - Fee \$15.00 and CREDIT CARD ONLY, per CAR. ALL graduates, students, parents, and friends/community members attending must pay the \$15 fee at the parking lot entrances.
 - o Gates: the open gates will be Gates A and B, with graduates entering through the Corral Entrance to the LEFT of Gate A.
- HANDICAP/HEARING ACCOMMODATIONS: Parking is available for all ADA guests in all parking lots on a first-come, first-served basis. Please make sure to display official placards. Also, there will be hearing accommodations section, should you require these services, please let our Graduation Coordinator, Mrs. Blum via email.
- **FOOD:** There will be a few concessions stands open with food and drink items for sale. Card purchases only.
- <u>BACKPACKS</u>, <u>BAGS</u>, <u>and STROLLERS</u>: No bags exceeding 12"x12"x12" are permitted and all are subject to search upon entry. Backpacks are not permitted, outside of diaper and medical bags. Strollers which are too large to fold under your seat have to be checked in at Guest Services at the Gate A entrance.
- NO BALLOONS ALLOWED
- GATE ENTRY:
 - o Graduates are to arrive at 8:00am through the Corral Entrance to the LEFT of Gate A No exceptions. No early arrivals without a staff member with a school ID.
 - o Public gates (A and B) open at 8:00am as well.
- GRADUATION DIPLOMA COVERS AND PROGRAMS: When students exit the graduation, they will be escorted to receive their diploma covers as well as a brand-new event program for your keeping as they exit the arena.
- **GRADUATION DAY PICTURES:** All students attending graduation will have 3 pictures taken as they graduate (Plain background, American Flag, and with the principal during diploma hand off). You will receive information regarding purchasing after the event from Grad Images and Balfour.
