Good afternoon East Lake families,

This is Dr. Smith with your weekly call-out:

We have already completed 4 weeks of school. Thank you again to our parents and East Lake community for working with us with all things ELHS. Our goal is 100% student success at all levels and we can't do that without you, so thank you for your support. A few new items this week: Testing, Parking, Tutoring/Test Prep. As always, we have a lot of information to cover. Please review my email carefully and thoroughly.

Focus:

- Check your students grades in Focus weekly. I will be sending out a mid-point progress report next week (through Focus) but grades are always accessible at any time to view on Focus.

PM1 Testing:

- All 9th and 10th grade students will sit for our first progress monitoring (PM1) state test for reading with their English class on Tuesday (9/9). AP English Comp student will test Wednesday (9/10).
- Students need to bring their school issued laptops, fully charged on their test day.
- It's very important that students are well rested, have a good breakfast, and take their time on the assessment.
- Students need to take this test seriously as the subsequent tests (PM2 and PM3) are based on results of PM1.
- Testing begins first thing at 7:25am and lasts through the end of 4th period (additional time will be afforded if needed). Students should report directly to their testing room on test day.
- Make sure your student has confirmed their testing date and room with their English teacher so they are ready to report promptly on their scheduled day.

Absences and Permission to Leave (PTL):

- Click the appropriate link and you will complete a brief form and we take care of the rest. No need to call or email anymore.

- **VERY IMPORTANT:** The online PTL process is ONLY to be completed by a parent or guardian.
 - Students that complete this form will receive disciplinary consequences.
 - Parents may receive school contact to verify the form.
 - Please check your student's attendance regularly.
 - Focus will send a daily communication if your student is absent.

Tardies:

- **VERY IMPORTANT:** Please address getting to class on time with your student.
- Tardies follow a progressive disciplinary pattern:
 - 1st-3rd – warning, minor infraction, parent contact
 - 4th-5th – lunch detention, parent contact
 - 6th-7th – after-school detention, parent contact
 - 8th – 1 day consequence IC, parent contact
 - 9th – 2-3 days consequence IC/ABS, parent contact conference
 - 10th – Parent conference

Cell Phones and Headphones:

- Cellphones are only allowed before/after school and during lunch.
 - Phones and other electronic devices (e.g. headphones, smart watch) must be turned off and put away during instructional time.
 - A teacher may approve device use but this will be rare.

- Headphones are not allowed to be used during instructional time. They may be used at lunch.
- We have had several students wearing their headphones in the hallway during class transitions. Students need to be able to hear information and directives during class transitions. Please discuss this with your student to put away their headphones.

Dress Code:

 - Dress code will be enforced. Please discuss the dress code with your student and check daily their attire.
 - For both boys and girls, key issues with dress code: **shirts that do not cover the stomach, spandex shorts.**

School Entry/Exit & Safety:

- Gates open at 7:00 AM along with the Cafeteria
 - Buildings and classrooms open at 7:15 AM
 - 5-minute warning bell at 7:20 AM
 - 1-minute warning bell at 7:24 AM
- Doors remain locked during the day per safety policy following the 7:25 AM start bell.
 - Students are to never prop open doors or let anyone in on campus.
 - Late arrivals must enter through the front office.
- Students have been doing a great job with entering through the front gate by the main office. All late arrivals and those leaving early, we will continue that process.

Parking

- Parking tags must be purchased to park on campus.
- Park ONLY in the space you were assigned.
- Tag pickup is in student services. Please see Mrs. Ramos before/after school or during lunch.

Car line (drop off and pick up):

- Follow traffic patterns as instructed.
 - PM: have your student cross and walk down the walkway to find your car. Several cars wait to pick up at the crosswalk near the front and this causes a break in the flow of traffic.
- All drop off and pick ups need to move through the car line.
 - Please, **DO NOT** drop off in neighborhoods, in the student parking lot, or on the side of the road.
- Leave a little earlier to ensure you get to school on-time.
 - School will start at 7:25am and the north gates will close to all students to maintain security of our campus.
 - All late arriving students will report to the front gate at the main office and will receive a tardy pass.

Student Passwords:

- A reminder to students to use a secure password to access your PCSB R2.D2 account. There have been several instances already this year where student passwords have been compromised.
- Do not use your student number, School name or mascot, favorite teacher's name, or anything easy to figure out as part of your password. Also do not share your password under any circumstances.
- If you feel your account has been compromised, let a teacher know as quickly as possible and change your password. If you need assistance, let an administrator know. Ultimately, you are responsible for all activity linked to your student account.

- If your child had an approved free/reduced meal status last year, it will expire on Sept. 23.
 - A new application must be submitted for the 2025-26 school year to continue receiving meal benefits.
 - If a new application is not submitted, then, beginning Sept. 24, your student will need to pay for lunch.
- All students at East Lake High School are eligible to receive a free breakfast every day with no application needed.
- We encourage all families who believe they may be eligible to apply. There are additional scholarship funds and assistance available for standardized testing fees for students from qualifying families.
