 - 3- Social Science
 - 2- World Language (sequential, in same language)



Largo High School **Documentation of College Visit**

Executive Internship Program

- ➤ Application due: January 31st 2020
- The Pinellas County Schools Executive Internship Program is a program designed for motivated, academically talented high school seniors who wish to explore career options before investing themselves in college programs. Must have an unweighted GPA of 3.0 or higher.
- ➤ Dual Enrollment: Earn 3 college credits per semester
 - Summer unpaid internships for 16 hours
 - Fall and/or spring for:
 - ≥1 or 2 class periods for 10 hours per week
 - ≥3 class periods for 15 hours per week

PTC Dual Enrollment

- ➤ Eligibility Requirements
 - Be at least **16 years old** and entering their junior or senior year in high school
 - ☐ Have a minimum cumulative unweighted **GPA of 2.0**, or 2.5 GPA for medical-related programs
- ➤ Over 20 programs available!
- Return completed application to their high school counselor, with all necessary signatures
 - Once the application has been process, the student will be contacted regarding a shadowing date (required)
