(ex. On the first day of Holiday Break, Officer Buckle gave to me: 1 shiny green helmet.)	Write an informational text to teach someone about something you like to do when you are not in school.
Observe plants and animals in nature. List the plant or animal that you see and the current stage of their life cycle.	Going somewhere? Take a book with you and read. Take a picture of yourself or draw a sketch of yourself reading at this place! Be sure to tell the name of the place!	Write a thank you letter to someone who has done something nice for you this year. Be sure to give it to him/her!
