Attention All Parents:

In order to assist you and your student efficiently and to lessen your wait time picking up your child, please send in a note with your student in advance of when s/he needs to be released from school early. Your child will take the note to the front office first thing in the morning rather than to a teacher. The office clerk will issue your child a permit to leave which s/he will show to their teacher at the beginning of the class they are leaving. 

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Congratulations to Ms. Boylen's 8th grade culinary arts students!



Thurgood Student Wins SPIFFS Art Competition


