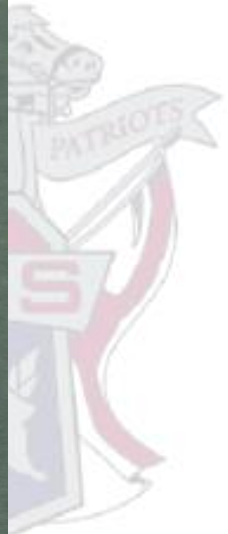

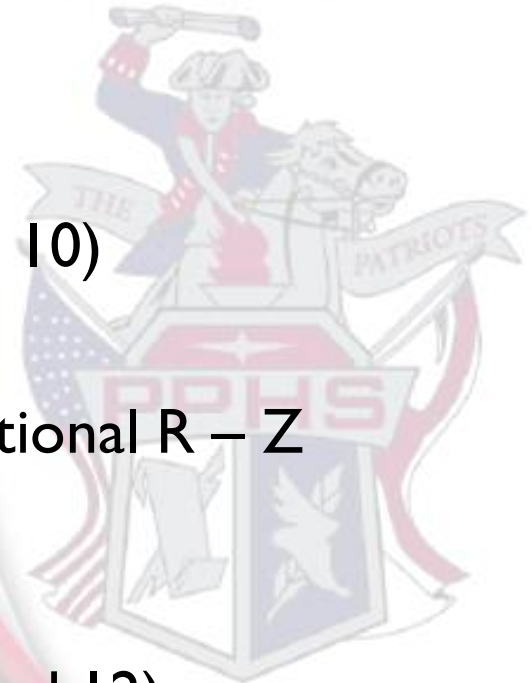

Campus Safety

- Cameras are utilized to monitor students who enter through all doors including the main entrance.
- After 7:25am, students should only enter or exit the building through the main entrance
- Students may not open exterior doors for other students and/or adults at any time
- Officer Behar and Officer Piccione are the School Resource Officers at our school. Should you have any questions or concerns, feel free to ask them or just stop and say hello!

Health Safety

- Students and adults are expected to wear masks at all times unless they are actively eating or drinking.
- Masks must cover nose and mouth and cannot be made of any material with holes.
- If a student chooses to not wear a mask regularly, the student will have the option of moving to either MyPCS or Pinellas Virtual School.
- Students are expected to maintain a social distance of 6 feet when possible
- There are hand sanitizer dispensers outside of each wing and throughout the school
- Please wash your hands regularly

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Lunch and Snack Break

- Students will have a 10 minute snack break after their first class every day
- Lunch will be at the end of the day
- Students will be free to eat in the mall, the courtyard by the auditorium and the courtyard next to the bus loop
- Students are expected to maintain social distance while eating and wear their masks if they are not actively eating or drinking

Graduation Requirements

- GPA starts the second you take your high school class. You need a minimum 2.0 GPA to graduate.
- You will earn course credit with each successful completion of a course
- You need 24 credits to graduate:
 - 4 Math
 - 4 English
 - 3 Science (1 must be Biology)
 - 3 Social Studies (World History, US History, Economics, US Government)
 - 1 Fine Arts
 - 1 HOPE
 - 8 Electives
 - 1 Online Course
- You also need to pass the Algebra I EOC and Grade 10 FSA-Reading and Writing or an ACT/SAT Concordant Score

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Graduation Requirements

- PPHS Students are expected to earn an Accelerated Credit. You can earn an Accelerated credit by:
 - Successful completion of Dual Enrollment course(s)
 - Earning a 3 or higher on any Advanced Placement test
 - Earning an Industry Certification (Microsoft Office Specialist bundle, Adobe product, ServeSafe, ASE)

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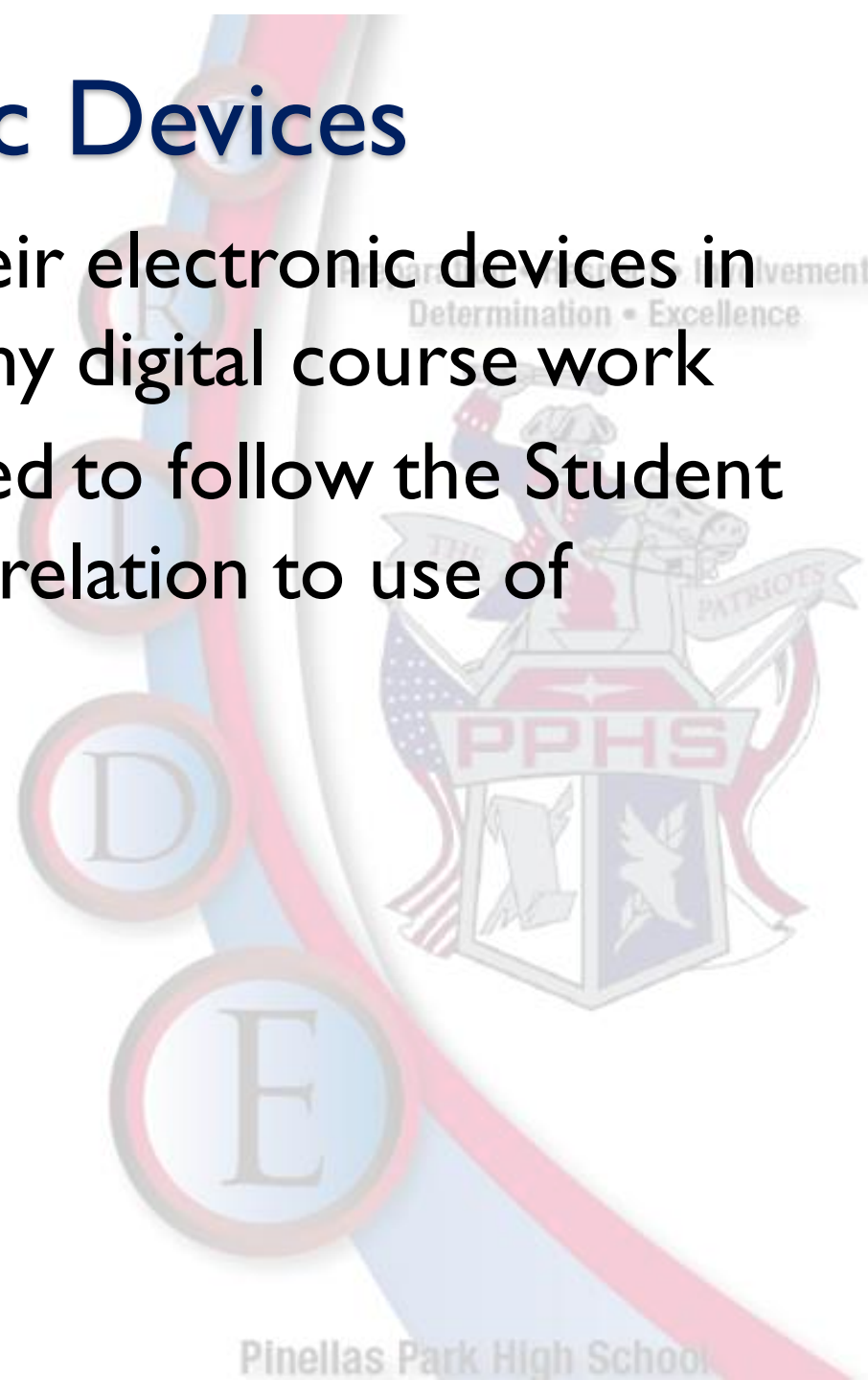
Freshmen Success

- Success in high school has a lot to do with organization.
- Students should utilize the calendar in their phone, the dashboard in Canvas or a planner to record important due dates and dates of assessments
- Freshmen can use both Canvas and Focus to monitor their grades. Parents can also monitor student grades through Focus
- If a parent needs a Focus username or password, they can visit their closest school or call PPHS.

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Electronic Devices

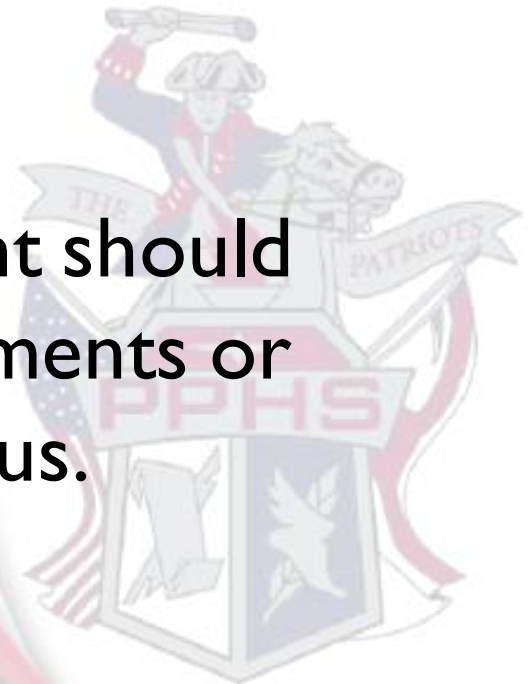
- Students may use their electronic devices in class to assist with any digital course work

Attendance

- Documentation for a student absences should be emailed to 3421.DPClerk@PCSB.org
- If a student is absent, the student should check Canvas for missed assignments or email their teacher through Focus.

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Attendance

- Under Florida State Law, excessive absences (excused or unexcused) can cause a student to lose their driver's license, or the privilege of getting a license, until the age of 18.
- If you leave during the day or arrive late to school due to a doctor's appointment you must email a doctor's note.

Pass-To-Leave

- Need to leave school during the day:
 - email a note to your student's office prior to the day of the needed PTL
 - Note to include student name, student grade level, reason for leaving, time to be picked up, name of the person coming for the student, a parent phone number **to verify** the note.

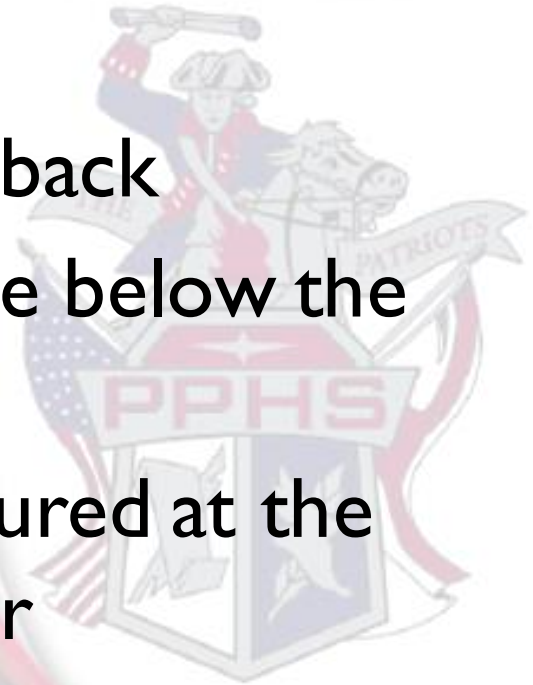
Tardy

- If you are late to class, you should report to Park Place to get a pass.
- If you are more than 10 minutes late to class, you need to report to your administrator.
- After 5 tardies during a quarter, a coaching conversation and a phone call home will take place
- At the 11th tardy, the student will receive an administrative referral

Dress Code

- Students should follow the Code of Conduct in regards to attire
- Shirts should cover shoulders and back
- Skirts, shorts and dresses should be below the fingertips
- All pants and shorts should be secured at the waist with a belt if needed to cover undergarments

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Dress Code

- Students may not wear hats, hoodies, bandanas or sunglasses
- Safe and appropriate footwear must be worn
- All clothing, masks, or jewelry shall be free of the following: profanity; violent images, wording or suggestion; sexually suggestive phrases or images; gang related symbols; alcohol, tobacco, drugs or advertisements for such products and any other images or phrases that may disrupt the learning environment.

Dress Code- Face Masks

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- Face masks must be worn at all times covering the nose and mouth, unless actively eating or drinking
- Acceptable face coverings include: paper or disposable face masks, cloth face masks, neck gaiters/buffs, or other cloth apparel completely covering the mouth and nose.
- Face coverings may not be made of mesh, lace, or have any holes (including exhalation holes)

- Please listen to morning announcements and check our website regularly to learn how to get involved
- All club meetings will take place via Microsoft Teams for at least the first 9 weeks

- Students will not receive lockers this year, please plan accordingly

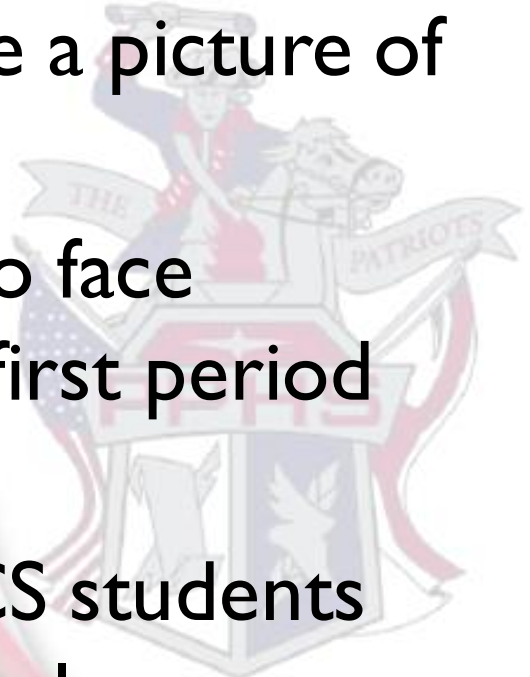
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Schedules and First Day
