The Diagnostic 3 window opens on April 10th and runs through April 28th. Getting good data is EXTREMELY important, as it helps us to place students accordingly for the following school year. If completing the assessment during the window is an issue, please have your administrator over reading contact Beth Anderson with an alternative proposal. The goal is for students to meet stretch growth by the end of the year. During your upcoming PLC's, teachers should create a school-wide plan for testing and ensure all stakeholders are aware of the plan.
