988 Suicide and Crisis Hotline

The NIMH (National Institute of Mental Health) reports that, after years of advocacy and preparation, **988 is now available nationwide as the new number to contact for mental health, substance use and suicide crises** — a simple, easy-to-remember way for people to get help. 988 is the new three-digit dialing code connecting people to the existing National Suicide Prevention Lifeline (now the 988 Suicide and Crisis Lifeline) where compassionate, accessible care and support is available for anyone experiencing mental health-related distress — whether that is thoughts of suicide, mental health or substance use crisis, or any other kind of emotional distress. People can also dial 988 if they are worried about a loved one who may need crisis support.

Suicide is the <u>2nd leading</u> cause of death among people aged 10–14 and the 3rd leading cause of death among people aged 15-24 in the U.S.

• Annual prevalence of serious thoughts of suicide, by U.S. demographic group:

18.8% of high school students

45% of LGBTQ youth

The <u>highest rates</u> of suicide in the U.S. are among American Indian/Alaska Natives followed by non-Hispanic whites.

Lesbian, gay and bisexual youth are <u>nearly 4x</u> more likely to attempt suicide than straight youth.

So, what does this all mean for PSS?

Many of our students come from trauma-impacted families and communities and may have difficulty transitioning into the learning environment. Coupled with the high rates of anxiety and depression in children; trauma, depression, and anxiety can challenge delivery of classroom instruction and make it at times feel impossible to teach and learn.

Service delivery to many of our students can start at home with the new 988 system. Our students are very proficient at the use of technology and texting. The 988 system is available at their fingertips 24 hours a day. I student in crisis does not have to wait for an appointment or to see a counselor to discuss their feelings during times when they feel their most vulnerable or anxious to discuss feelings of emotional distress. It is suspected the students will feel comfortable with the texting format that 988 provides until the student can be seen in person by a mental health professional. Posters for the new 988 system has been placed in the cafeteria, student services offices, and hallways.
