

Why do our teen girls feel so hopeless and sad?

The CDC released the Biannual Youth Risk Behavior Survey which reported that 57% of teen girls report chronic feelings of sadness or hopelessness. Girls rated almost double of that reported by boys. The survey found that 30% of the girls in 2021 reported having clinical risk indicators for suicidality and 18% reported experiencing sexual violence. In addition to the sexual related violence numbers 14% reported being forced to have sex.

#### Questions to Consider:

- What is the relationship between alarming levels of sexual violence and girls' feelings of sadness and hopelessness?
- What can your school and classrooms do to keep all children safe considering this report?
- Do your school have safe reporting procedures and strict tolerance warnings for verbal and physical sexual assault and aggression?

In a survey by Project ASPEN more than 3/4th of parents called for depression screenings at school. More than 75% of parents surveyed valued students having a depression screening at school. The parents felt that these screenings would prevent serious mental health issues, drug or alcohol abuse, and poor academic performance.

What does this all mean for Pinellas Secondary?

Amid all the pressure for providing academic rigor and aligning to safe guarding procedures it is important that we pay attention to students with potential mental health risk indicators. Many students, especially our girls may present with horse playing behavior and verbally aggressive outburst. They often lack proper social skills and expressive language skills. Taking a moment to dive deeper to explore potential underlying issues that cause girls to act out may be the difference between providing services and unaddressed feelings of sadness, hopelessness, and incidents of sexual violence. Most parents want to have the school to uncover these issues and assist them with referrals to the appropriate services to help improve their child's engagement and academic levels as well as address any potential abusive situations. Trainings such as Youth Mental Health First Aid and Child Abuse Reporting is provided to help you respond to these behaviors and act when reports of emotional or abusive concerns are disclosed.
