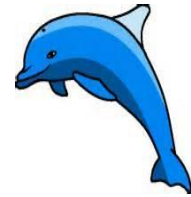
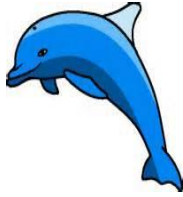

## Parents.... It's Testing Time!



Schools test children to improve educational programs, to assess how well children are doing in school, and to report to the public on a school's academic progress. Parents can help their children during this time in many ways.

### **When your child is taking a test, you can help by making sure your child:**

- \*Gets plenty of rest the night before the test
- \*Has a good breakfast the morning of the test
- \*Arrives to school on time the morning of the test

### **Other Ways to Help Children Learn at Home**

- \*Be Interested – Ask your child about their day
  - \*Ask to see your child's schoolwork
  - \*Attend Parent/Teacher Conferences
- \*Encourage your child to bring home books from the library
  - \*Take your child to the public library
  - \*Ask your child to read aloud to you
- \*Make sure your child completes his or her homework
  - \*If your child never has homework, find out why
- \*Plan a time and place for your child to study (not in front of the television)
