Fight The Cold and Flu with Healthy Habits to Practice Now

Some people have a misconception that if they're healthy, the flu is not as serious. While certain groups are more at risk for getting the flu like people with immune deficiency conditions, this doesn't mean that the flu can't impact healthy people. Even if you are healthy, you are at risk of serious complications of the flu. Below are some simple healthy habits you and your family can take as precautionary measures to help keep you healthy this cold and flu season.

Get flu shots for yourself and everyone in your family. Practice proper hand washing.

Avoid touching your face.

Cover your coughs and sneezes.

Healthy lifestyle---Healthy living habits can promote a healthy immune system. This means getting enough sleep daily, eating balanced meals and exercising frequently are all things you can do to strengthen your immune system and avoid the risk of catching the flu. In addition, don't smoke. Lastly, eating a diet high in fruits and vegetables can help boost your immune system as well

Stay at home if you are sick.—According to the CDC, people with flu are most contagious in the first 3 to 4 days after their illness begins. Children and some people with weakened immune systems may pass the virus for longer than 7 days. If you do get sick with the flu, try and isolate yourself to avoid spreading the virus. If you are sick with flu-like illness, PCSB Policy states that you need to keep your child(ren) home for at least 24 hours after your fever is gone.
