

2025-2026 What is a Title I School?

- Title I is a federal program that gives extra funding to schools to help students succeed in reading, math, and other subjects.
- The funding is based on the number of students who qualify for free or reduced lunch, which shows the level of need in the school.
- The goal is to make sure all children get the same chance to learn, no matter their family's income.
- The money is used for things like extra teachers, small group instruction, tutoring, and learning resources to support students.
- Parents are important partners, and Title I schools encourage family involvement through meetings, workshops, and activities.

Title I schools receive federal dollars to fund the following:

- **Personnel** to help students succeed. At North Shore, we have a part time MTSS Coach funded by Title 1. This MTSS Coach **support teachers and teams with data-driven problem solving and implementation of tiered interventions** to address students' academic, behavioral, and social-emotional needs and **provides coaching, professional development, and progress monitoring** to ensure fidelity of MTSS practices and improve student outcomes
- **Academic workshops/family nights** – Literacy night, STEM/Multicultural night, Middle School information night, and the Art and Student Showcase are offered to students and their families. We provide families the opportunity to learn strategies to help their children to be better readers, mathematicians, and scientists.
- **Professional Development** for staff members including a stipend to be paid to all staff who participate in school-based trainings after school. Staff participate in district-wide trainings and on-campus book studies.
- **Promise Time program/ELP program** – after school tutoring program. Materials and funds for salaries are provided for reading and math tutoring, drama and band club, spelling bee club, and coding.
