Cheerleaders cheer for both the football and basketball seasons. Seniors, who make the football squad, may decline to participate in basketball season. Between Varsity and JV, a total of 36 cheerleaders is allowed for each sport (season).

Football Squad – top 36 tryout scores

- Varsity: 24 cheerleaders
- JV: 12 cheerleaders

Basketball Squad – number to be determined

- Top 36 tryout scores minus football Seniors and those participating in OFHS winter sports
- Next top tryout scores are added to reach a 36-member squad

Tryouts

Practices for cheer tryouts are mandatory. For the judged tryouts, prospective cheerleaders will be given a number for anonymity purposes and will try out in front of impartial judges. The judges' scores are final. After the judges submit their scores, the Head Coach will make the final determination of team members based on scores.

What is being judged?

- 3 cheers
- toe-touch jump & jump of choice
- dance
- sharpness, voice projection, & smiling with enthusiasm (remember to show spirit between each cheer)

- 1. NO jewelry, including body piercings

 i.e., <u>NO</u> sharp tips
