Good afternoon Tech High Families,

We are getting close to the end of our school year and you will need the following helpful information so students can plan accordingly:

Last days to turn in work: May 22 is just a few days away. Most teachers are requiring all work to be competed and turned in by that date. Some teachers have already cut off the opportunity to turn in late work and this has been communicated on their own TEAMS channels. If you have any questions, please check with your individual teachers. If something has not been graded, make sure you have emailed the teacher because there is not notification that late work has been turned in, that information must come from you. Just a reminder, semester grades are calculated by taking the average of the quarter 3 and 4 final grades.

Textbook return: You will need to turn in your text books by driving through our car line on the following dates: **Thursday, May 21, 7-9 AM, 4-6 PM or Friday, May 22, 11 AM-1 PM**. We will have staff members collecting books and giving you receipts for your returned materials. If you have borrowed a **digital device** from the school, we will <u>not</u> be collecting them at this time.

The last week of school: No school on Monday, May 25, Memorial Day, but there is school May 26-29, Tuesday-Friday. There are some wrap up activities that you will not want to miss. Last day of classes is May 29.
