



How would you rate the overall quality of your child's school? (N=16)




### **Overall Quality: Comparison Over Time**

How would you rate the overall quality of your child's school?







How strongly do you agree or disagree with the following statements?










How strongly do you agree or disagree with the following statements?







How strongly do you agree or disagree with the following statements?






