- ✓ If we can achieve the percentages in each cell, we would earn a total of 610 points out of a total of 800 points → 76% of the total points to be earned.
- ✓ We would earn a stronger A grade from last year (68% points earned).

What's Happening to Respond to the Data?


- ✓ Data chats have occurred with teachers to discuss their students' PM1 data.
- ✓ Teachers understand how they can contribute to helping Bay Vista achieve its school goals by:
 - 1. Using not only PM1 data, but other district and classroom data points, tiering the students by:
 - (a) who's already on target for proficiency,
 - (b) who is progressing towards proficiency, but needs additional classroom supports
 - (c) who needs more intensive supports to progress towards proficiency
 - 2. Teachers review lowest benchmarks, by student performance, that have been taught and select curriculum resources to re-teach and remediate during intervention.

What's Happening to Respond to the Data?

- 3. Teachers develop or select activities to support differentiated learning for "pop-up" groups during instructional time.
 - Teachers intentionally plan activities for students who may not totally grasp what is being taught to provide them additional supports for understanding the lesson, as well as plan for those who may understand, but want to extend their thinking.
- ✓ Depending on which students need the most support, students may receive intervention (small group pullout with teacher) between 1 and 4 days per week.
- ✓ Teachers are monitoring student progress in a variety of ways, including:
 - Reviewing student work from their Choice Boards
 - Using Exit Tickets to determine the differentiated activities needed to support learning
 - Monitoring time on task with Amira and Dreambox and assigned lesson completion scores.
- ✓ Parent-teacher conferences to let parents know how their child is doing.

PM2 Testing Window opens in December

- We anticipate seeing an increase in overall proficiency in ELA as benchmarks students are tested on are cyclical over the course of the year.
- We anticipate seeing a slight increase in overall math proficiency as more benchmarks have been taught, however many of the benchmarks to be taught will be covered between January and May.
- We won't get panicked if there isn't a significant boost in performance from PM1 to PM2.
