Prepare your documents

- Your ID
- Your social security number
- Your permanent resident card (if you are not a citizen)
- 2018 W2 Forms
- 2018 tax records

You will need the same information for your parents if you are a dependent student (24 years or younger).

Create you FSA ID

This will be your electronic signature to your FAFSA. It is your way to log in to your application and access to various websites related to federal student aid.



If you are a dependent student, your parents will need their own FSA ID and must also electronically sign the application for it to be complete.

Sign and submit your application-Dependent student applications must have parent signature.

Wait for your confirmation number....
Visit the Financial Aid office

After 3-5 business days to check your status.



- ❑ If you are a male between 18 and 25, it is required that you register with the selective service.
- ❑ If you did not file your taxes, a letter of non-filing along with a wage and income transcript from the IRS will be required.

To be Eligible to receive federal student aid, you must:



- Be a citizen or eligible noncitizen of the United States.
- Have a high school diploma or a (GED) certificate.
- Maintain satisfactory academic progress.
- Not owe any money on a federal student grant or be in default on a federal student loan.
- Register (or already be registered) with the Selective Service System.
- Not have a conviction for the possession or sale of illegal drugs for an offense that occurred while you were receiving federal student aid (such as grants, work-study, or loans).
