Creative Ways to Keep Kids Reading During the Holidays

The holidays are a busy time of the year, and we often forget to do the things that we love the mostlike reading. Here are some fun ways to promote reading during these busy weeks.

 Embrace The Joy of a Read Aloud - Listen to an audiobook on all those drives while you are out working on your holiday to-do list. Or while baking in the kitchen together or while wrapping presents, crafting, etc. You could also have someone in your family read out loud. Someone could be the designated reader, or you could take turns.

Holiday Count Down - You can choose how many days you are going to count down. Wrap a book for each day, and either take turns opening the packages or have enough books for everyone to open their own each night. Many people do this with holiday picture books, but you can also select a book that is the right reading level for the recipient. And no need to break the bank here. You can get used books or library books (assuming you can check them out for the duration of the countdown).

 Read the book/Watch the Movie - Read a book together and then watch the movie together. This is one of my family's favorites. There is always extra motivation to participate when kids know that they get to do a movie night after you finish the book.

 Learn About Other Holidays Through Books -When we think of winter holidays we often think of Christmas and Hanukkah, but there are so many more out there to explore. You could learn about Kwanzaa, Diwali, Chinese New Year, etc.

 Reading Challenges - Many kids love the joy of a challenge or competition. Make a game out of reading and see who can get the most in each category. You could have a winner for each category or 1st, 2nd, and 3rd places for
categories done as a large group, like at school. Prizes can be as simple as bragging rights, certificates, little treats, bookmarks, etc.


