




COUNSELOR CORNER







CAFETERIA






Student Attendance Policy

OLDSMAR ELEMENTARY SCHOOL FOLLOWS THE PINELLAS COUNTY SCHOOL BOARD'S STUDENT ATTENDANCE POLICY AS DESCRIBED IN THE CURRENT CODE OF STUDENT CONDUCT (PG. 51-54) DISTRIBUTED AT THE BEGINNING OF THE SCHOOL YEAR. AN ABSENCE WILL BE CONSIDERED EXCUSED IF THE OFFICE RECEIVES A PHONE CALL, AN EMAIL IS SENT TO THE TEACHER, NOTIFICATION OF ABSENCE ON SCHOOL WEBSITE, OR A NOTE IS RECEIVED BY THE TEACHER EXPLAINING A CHILD'S ABSENCE WITHIN TWO DAYS.

THE FOLLOWING ARE THE ONLY EXCUSED REASONS FOR MISSING SCHOOL

- A. THE STUDENT IS ILL OR INJURED. THE MAXIMUM NUMBER OF DAYS THAT A STUDENT MAY BE ABSENT WITHOUT ACCEPTABLE DOCUMENTATION JUSTIFYING THE ABSENCE IS FIVE (5) CONSECUTIVE DAYS.
- B. THERE IS A MAJOR ILLNESS IN THE STUDENT'S IMMEDIATE FAMILY (THIS MEANS PARENTS, BROTHERS, SISTERS, GRANDPARENTS, OR OTHERS LIVING IN THE HOME).
- C. THERE IS A DEATH IN THE IMMEDIATE FAMILY.
- D. THE STUDENT ATTENDS RELIGIOUS INSTRUCTION OR THERE IS A RELIGIOUS HOLIDAY IN THE STUDENT'S OWN FAITH.
- E. THE STUDENT IS REQUIRED BY SUMMONS, SUBPOENA OR COURT ORDER TO APPEAR IN COURT. A COPY OF THE SUBPOENA OR COURT ORDER MUST BE GIVEN TO THE PRINCIPAL.
- F. SPECIAL EVENT. EXAMPLES OF SPECIAL EVENTS INCLUDE IMPORTANT PUBLIC FUNCTIONS, CONFERENCES, STATE/NATIONAL COMPETITIONS, AS WELL AS EXCEPTIONAL CASES OF FAMILY NEED. THE STUDENT MUST GET PERMISSION FROM THE PRINCIPAL AT LEAST FIVE DAYS PRIOR TO THE ABSENCE.
- G. THE STUDENT HAS A SCHEDULED MEDICAL OR DENTAL APPOINTMENT. IT IS RECOMMENDED, WHEN POSSIBLE, TO SCHEDULE APPOINTMENTS OUTSIDE OF SCHOOL HOURS, SO STUDENTS DO NOT MISS INSTRUCTION.
- H. STUDENTS HAVING, OR SUSPECTED OF HAVING, A COMMUNICABLE DISEASE OR INFESTATION WHICH CAN BE TRANSMITTED ARE TO BE EXCLUDED FROM SCHOOL AND ARE NOT ALLOWED TO RETURN TO SCHOOL UNTIL THEY NO LONGER PRESENT A HEALTH HAZARD (F.S. 1003.22). EXAMPLES OF COMMUNICABLE DISEASES AND INFESTATIONS INCLUDE, BUT ARE NOT LIMITED TO, FLEAS, HEAD LICE, RINGWORM, IMPETIGO AND SCABIES. STUDENTS ARE ALLOWED A MAXIMUM OF THREE (3) EXCUSED DAYS FOR EACH INFESTATION OF HEAD LICE UNLESS EXTENDED BY PRINCIPAL.

STUDENTS ON FIELD TRIPS AND STUDENTS WHO ATTEND ALTERNATIVE TO SUSPENSION PROGRAMS ARE NOT CONSIDERED ABSENT. ABSENCES NOT REPORTED BY PHONE CALL, EMAIL, ONLINE NOTIFICATION, OR NOTE TO THE TEACHER WILL BE CONSIDERED UNEXCUSED. VACATION, TRAVEL AND FAMILY VISITS ARE CONSIDERED AN UNEXCUSED ABSENCE. TARDIES AND EARLY SIGN OUTS ARE CONSIDERED EXCUSED FOR THE SAME REASONS LISTED ABOVE. CLASSWORK/HOMEWORK IS REQUIRED TO BE MADE UP DURING OR AFTER AN ABSENCE. UPON RETURN TO SCHOOL FOLLOWING AN ABSENCE, THE STUDENT IS GIVEN AS MANY DAYS TO MAKE UP WORK AS DAYS ABSENT. STUDENTS WHO DEMONSTRATE A CONSISTENT PATTERN OF NON-ATTENDANCE MAY BE REFERRED TO THE SCHOOL'S CHILD STUDY TEAM.

21ST CENTURY LEARNING AND THE 4C'S


If you search online for 21st Century 4 C skills, you will find a bunch of sources that list the following skills: Communication, Collaboration, Critical Thinking, and Creative Thinking. Creativity is not only a skill some people are born with and have lots of, according to some researchers it can also be taught. I am not going to get into listing all of the resources and research articles here however, I am going to provide 3 short activities that you can easily do at home with your child to allow them to practice one of the four parts of creativity- Fluency (the other 3 are flexibility, originality, elaboration.)

Give your child a piece of paper and a pencil. Set a timer for 5 minutes. Have them make a list (as many as they can think of in 5 minutes.)

For October- List everything that is orange

For November- List everything that makes noise

For December- List things that come in pairs

The morning show will include informative announcements. Classroom lessons will be presented in each classroom (K-5) that will deal with Bully Prevention. Students will learn the definition of bullying, conflict, and horseplay. Students will also be taught ways to handle the situation if they are being bullied or if they witness someone else being bullied. The students will discuss the difference between "Tattling" and "Reporting" and will be educated on the importance of reporting bullying so that it can be dealt with appropriately. 



Nurse's station

National Dental Hygiene Month is observed every October to raise awareness of the importance of good oral health.

- Oral Hygiene for Children

As kids grow up, their oral hygiene habits should grow with them.

Kids have all their baby teeth by the age of 3. These are called primary teeth. Baby teeth start falling out around age 6; that's when the permanent, or adult, teeth start coming in. Gaps between baby teeth are normal. They make room for the permanent teeth. Most permanent teeth come in by age 13.

- Here are some tips to help keep your child's teeth healthy and strong starting at age 3:
 - Use a pea-sized amount of fluoride toothpaste and make sure your child spits it out after brushing
 - Be sure your child brushes for at least 2 minutes twice a day
 - Start flossing as soon as teeth touch, or even earlier to help build good habits.
 - Help your child brush and floss, and remind him or her to pay attention to the back teeth.
 - Visit the dentist every 6 months.
