21st Century Learning and the 4 Cs submitted

One of the 4 C's for 21st century learning is critical thinking or evaluative thinking. Often, when faced with problems, we produce lots of solutions, other times we struggle. Sometimes it is helpful to organize our thinking to help us on our way to a viable and workable solution. There are many thinking skills we can draw from but one that is easy to use and can be useful is a strategy that comes from the work of Edward DeBono, he is the person responsible for coming up with the 6 thinking hats and he is also the man who came up with 10 CoRt (Cognitive Research Trust -the organization he was working for at the time) thinking skills of which one is P.M.I.(Plus, Minus, Interesting.)

When I practice this with students in class, we might look at an idea such as "by law, all cars must be yellow."

We then set up three columns and list under each, the "P" for what is good about that idea or what is positive, "M" for what is not good or a minus about the idea, and "I" for what is just interesting about it. This is a great tool for kids and adults alike particularly when deciding about an important idea or concept. For example, I could do a PMI exercise before deciding on a family vacation destination. Adults sometimes do this exercise in their heads, but it can be helpful to jot these ideas down as well.
