

## OLDSMAR ELEMENTARY PFEP 24-25 SUMMARY

Oldsmar Elementary School believes in involving parents in all aspects of its Title I programs, therefore our school will encourage parents to become active members of our School Advisory Council (SAC). More than 50 percent of the members of the SAC are required to be parent (non-employee) representatives. The SAC has the responsibility for developing, implementing, and evaluating the various school level plans, including the School Improvement Plan (SIP) and Parent and Family Engagement Plan (PFEP). Therefore, parents will be provided opportunities to give input in the development and decision-making process of all Title I activities related to the school. An annual evaluation will be conducted using surveys completed by stakeholders. The results will be analyzed to evaluate the effectiveness of the school's parent involvement program. Parents may request additional support either directly through their child's teacher or grade level administrator. A parent may also request support during regularly scheduled SAC or PTA meetings.

Program	Coordination
VPK	Oldsmar Elementary School and the VPK office will work together to coordinate transition programs for students entering the regular public school program. Activities may include: coordinating meetings with parents, VPK teachers, and the kindergarten teachers to discuss specific learning needs of students, and transition to kindergarten. All VPK classes will participate in 100 days to kindergarten to promote readiness skills.
Kindergarten Open House	Oldsmar Elementary School will provide families information that is important to help their children transition from PreK to Kindergarten.
Celebrate Literacy Events	Families will be invited to celebrate literacy practices with us at school. Teachers and others will share practices that promote reading fluency, comprehension, and phonemic awareness to increase at home skills.
Title 1 Family Meeting	During our family night, we will share with families the benefits of Title 1 programs and what specific ways they can support learning at home.
Student Led Conferences	This event will be held by the students and teachers to showcase their data to their students' parents. This event will take place each quarter during the year to showcase their success and areas of growth within each grade level.
Math & Science Night	This event will incorporate scientific experiments, mathematical games and other practices that will deepen the understanding of our families on grade level standards in both math and science.
Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA)	Supplemental instruction provided by the school will be discussed with parents during the development of the students' IEP.
