School's Mission Statement: The mission at Melrose Center for Journalism and Multimedia is to educate and prepare each student for college and career readiness, in order to: increase the academic performance of underserved students, develop effective educators, share successful practices with other forward-thinking educators, and catalyze change in Melrose.

Measurable Outcomes: Melrose Elementary aims to increase reading proficiency by 10% and math proficiency by 5% across all grade levels while improving attendance and family engagement participation rates.

Building Capacity of Families

Melrose Elementary will strengthen family-school partnerships through a variety of engaging and academic events, including:

- Literacy and Math Night: Interactive sessions to equip families with strategies that reinforce reading and math skills at home.
- Science Fair Information Night: A hands-on guide for families to support their children in completing science projects.
- All Pro Dads: Monthly breakfast meetings promoting positive father (or male mentor) involvement in student success.
- Moms Making Moments: Monthly gatherings for mothers and female guardians focused on connection, learning, and encouragement.
- Family Fun Nights and Academic Coaching Workshops: Designed to build trust, community, and shared accountability for student achievement. Information from all events will also be shared via newsletters, Class Dojo, and the school website for families unable to attend in person.

- Literacy and Math night for K-5 parents will provide reading and math strategies that parents might use to benefit their child in the area of reading and math. Literacy: The media specialist and Literacy CAS will share ways with parents to help their child become better readers and the and through this training parents will become more engaged in their child's daily reading habits ultimately increasing student's fluency and comprehension strategies. Math: The Math CAS and administration will provide family friendly, easy to do at home activities that will assist students in building their number sense and math fluency. Science Fair Information Night: Reviewing the scientific process with parents of 5th grade students will help build the science foundation so that students' science knowledge increases.

Families unable to attend our parent events will be able to gain access to the information through newsletters, websites, and parent conferences.

With the assistance of our SAC committees Melrose Elementary will provide opportunities throughout the school year for families and staff to come together in fellowship. Family Fun Nights are an honored tradition that allows home, community, and school to bond. Strengthening and fostering these relationships will allow students to become successful and therefore student achievement will increase.

Additional support will be provided to families through parent conferences and specialized meetings held through our guidance department. Our academic CAS coaches will also be available for parents to meet with to gain more ideas on how to assist at home.

Staff Professional Development related to Family Engagement

Melrose Elementary staff will receive professional learning focused on effective communication, cultural responsiveness, and strategies for involving parents as active partners in their child's academic success. Staff will participate in professional development sessions on family engagement best practices, data sharing, and collaboration to strengthen the school-home connection

Title I Annual Parent Meeting Experience

Melrose Elementary will host its Annual Title I Parent Meeting at the beginning of the school year to review Title I services, explain family rights, and discuss school programs. Melrose Elementary will collect parent feedback using surveys provided during the meeting and online versions shared through Class Dojo and the school website. Feedback will be reviewed by the school leadership team and the School Advisory Council (SAC) to identify trends, celebrate successes, and address areas of need. The results will be used to improve the design, timing, and focus of future parent events to better support families and increase engagement.
