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Principal's News

Greetings Belleair Families,

As we enter the New Year, thoughts generally turn to making resolutions. The New Year is seen as an opportunity for renewal, a time to assess our lives and consider how we might want to improve it. This is a great opportunity to help our Tigers focus on their goals and set their sights on success in the new year.

Some areas that scholars generally consider include:

Health Resolutions: eat less junk food, exercise more, get better sleep

Academic Resolutions: set up a homework routine, keep school materials organized

Relationship Resolutions: be an upstander, practice acts of kindness

Personal Growth Resolutions: learn a new hobby or skill, spend less time on devices

Ideas to help your child focus on their goals:

* Express goals positively: "To improve my reading" is a much better goal than



"Read without mistakes."

- * Be accurate: If scholars set an accurate goal, putting in dates, times and amounts so that achievement can be measured and they can be satisfied at achieving it.
- * Set Priorities: When scholars have several goals, give each a priority. This helps them avoid feeling overwhelmed and helps focus their attention to the more important ones.
- * Visibility: Write goals down to make them more meaningful. Consider putting goals into a Vision Board to help them focus.
- * Keep Goals Small: Urge scholars to keep their immediate goals small and achievable.

* Set Goals Scholars Have Control Over: There is nothing worse than failing to achieve a personal goal for reasons beyond the scholars' control.

One area that we have engaged in goal setting as a school in December was for scholars to meet their projected growth goal on the Measures of Academic Progress (MAP) Test. Those scholars who improved their reading and/or math score earned a N.U.T. (No Uniform Today) day ticket which can be redeemed on Friday, January 11th only. Included in this month's newsletter is a data chart that shows where our scholars are currently performing in Reading and Math.

Let's start 2019 on the right foot with a greater understanding of how your scholars can create achievable goals and objectives.
