HOW TO APPLY

Students who live north of SR 60 (Gulf-to-Bay) may apply only to the Center for Wellness at Palm Harbor University High School. Students who live south of Ulmerton Road may apply only to the Center for Wellness at Boca Ciega High School. Students who live north of Ulmerton Road and south of SR 60 may apply to either center but not both.

TRANSPORTATION

Arterial bus transportation (buses that operate on main roads with a limited number of stops) is provided to students who live more than two miles from the school. Magnet bus stop locations may require that parents drive their children to and from the stop.

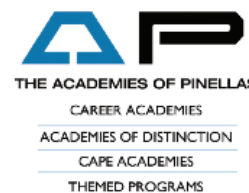

HEALTH CARE, PERSONAL WELL-BEING, DISEASE PREVENTION AND CAREER EXPLORATION

The Center for Wellness and Medical Professions offers our students a comprehensive program including unique opportunities and experiences with a focus on health care, personal well-being, disease prevention and career exploration. We are now a Center of Excellence, offering industry certification to our students before graduation.

The areas of study are designed for students:

- Who have an interest in entering a health career immediately following high school
- Who aspire to medical careers requiring vocational training and/or college degrees
- Who are pursuing careers requiring extensive postsecondary education and medical schools

what is a magnet?

Magnet programs focus on a certain theme with specialized curriculum in areas such as arts, communication, science and technology, and gifted studies. Some programs have eligibility requirements. See **How to Apply** section for details.

ADMISSIONS CRITERIA

PROGRAM TIER 1 (TECHNICAL):

- GPA > 2.0
- FSA T-score of 43 OR PSAT / ReadiStep Percentile Rank of 25 or higher OR Standardized test stanine scores > 4 in reading and math

Students successfully completing the curriculum will be qualified to apply for employment in careers such as:

- Nurse Assistant
- Patient Care Assistant
- Home Health Aide
- Medical Receptionist
- Pharmacy Aide
- Veterinary Aide

PROGRAM TIER 2 (PROFESSIONAL/LICENSED):

- GPA > 2.5
- FSA T-score of 52 OR PSAT / ReadiStep Percentile Rank of 61 or higher OR Standardized test stanine scores > 6 in reading and math

Students successfully completing the curriculum will be qualified to enter postsecondary institutions for further training leading to professional/licensed employment such as:

- Nurse
- Medical Technician
- Physical Therapist
- Dietitian
- Veterinarian Technician
- Community Health Educator
- Dental Hygienist
- Mortician
- Athletic Trainer
- Paramedic

PROGRAM TIER 3 (PRE-MEDICAL)

- GPA > 3.0
- FSA T-score of 62 OR PSAT / ReadiStep Percentile Rank of 90 or higher OR Standardized test stanine scores > 8 in reading and math

Students successfully completing the curriculum will be qualified to apply to institutions of higher learning requiring postgraduate studies and leading to professions such as:

- Medical Doctor
- Dentist
- Radiologist
- Pharmacist
- Veterinarian
