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

ABOUT US

Gibbs High School houses the Business, Economics, and Technology Academy (BETA). BETA is a career academy in which instruction is centered around business and technology systems. The program allows students to acquire knowledge and skills for immediate job placement upon graduation as well as fulfilling requirements for college entrance. BETA is a four-year program designed to immerse students in a comprehensive high school curriculum that blends business concepts, current technology skills, economic theories, business and industry identified worker competencies, and global marketplace awareness with traditional academic courses. BETA students will have an opportunity to earn industry certifications recognized around the world.

areas of study

BUSINESS, ECONOMICS, TECHNOLOGY ACADEMY

BETA provides students with four years of instruction that blends business and technological skills and knowledge into their academic courses. Each student selects a "pathway." Pathways of study are:

- Business Supervision and Management
- Digital Design
- Network Support Specialist (Cisco)
- Digital Media Technology
- Game/Simulation/Animation Visual Design

Students will prepare to continue their education in a post secondary institution, to enter a variety of business related career positions, or to enter the military while fulfilling all academic requirements for graduation. BETA's instructional activities are designed to prepare students for the challenging careers of the 21st century.

The program also offers students opportunities for career shadowing, consultation, internships, and work experience with business partners.
