Program Goal

To promote teacher training opportunities and academic rigor which will prepare students for academic and career areas requiring post-secondary education at a college, university, community college or technical institute and other career opportunities offering immediate employment options upon graduation. program of study

Students will be required to take Teaching Assisting Courses all four years of high school which explore the intricacies of teaching and the development of instructional delivery.



Students will spend a minimum of 150 hours observing and participating in learning activities focused in their major area.



While enrolled in the Center for Education and Leadership students may be able to earn up to 60 college credits during their four years of high school. As part of the regular course schedule students may be able to earn up to 23 dual enrollment credits with St. Petersburg College at Seminole High School beginning in tenth grade. Students will focus their studies on one or a combination of the three major areas of study: Math, Science or Language Arts.
