

Boca Ciega High School was built in 1953 at a cost of \$1.34 million. This facility is equipped with the most current technological features to take learning into the 21st century. Boca Ciega High School is one of the Florida "A" schools in Pinellas County and has received the Mayor's Top Apple Award for increased student achievement for the 2012 and 2013 school year. Boca Ciega High School has on-site college Dual Enrollment course offerings to include nine different courses, and currently offers 15 Advanced Placement courses.
