HOW TO APPLY

This is an area application program. Students must live in the appropriate designated application area when apply: Dunedin Highland Middle (north application area), Morgan Fitzgerald Middle (mid application area), Thurgood Marshall Fundamental Middle (south application area). There are entrance criteria to apply to these magnet schools. Students must meet all state requirements for gifted placement and have a gifted Educational Plan.

TRANSPORTATION

Arterial bus transportation (buses that operate on main roads with a limited number of stops) is provided to students who live more than two miles from the school. Magnet bus stop locations may require that parents drive their children to and from the stop.

The curriculum philosophy of the Middle School Centers for Gifted Studies is grounded in the belief that gifted students require comprehensive and on-going differentiated curriculum and instruction in order to develop their abilities appropriately. Rather than learning each subject as a separate entity, students discover how they are connected thus promoting in-depth learning and creative, critical and complex thinking.
